We have once again passed the summer solstice and look forward to the coming weeks of Summer. After experiencing the many events and opportunities to gather last year, I am truly looking forward to not only seeing you on Sunday mornings as we gather for worship, but I am also excited to see you 'out and about' (or 'oot 'n aboot' for those of Scandinavian descent) as we partake of the wider community offerings that gather us together in many and varied ways. Whether it is music, art, shipwreck treasures, kayaking, walking the loop, Wednesday picnics, sittin' on the dock of the bay, or any other possibility, we can surely find time to also sit in the presence of God in the midst of all of these offerings.

And now that the tent caterpillars have gone, we can get back to the business of re-creation through the metamorphosis of living always of God's presence (and maybe we will even notice that we can lift off like a beautiful butterfly).

MUSIC THEMED SUNDAYS THIS SUMMER!


On some of our Sunday services this summer we will be singing "themed music" for our songs. Here is the line up:

Thank you again for your help with this ongoing project.



ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - JUNE 8, 2023

Attendees: John Parker, Pastor Scott, Anita Holzemer, Lane Phelan, Anne Barry, Dave White, Jeanette Christensen, Special Guests Kayleigh Steiner of Youth Dynamics and Pat Carrie Smith

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. May minutes were approved as submitted.

Special Guest Report: Kayleigh Steiner of Youth Dynamics. Kayleigh shared her testimony and talked about her work with Youth Dynamics. She asked for monetary support for her work with YD. We added her request to new business.

Treasurer's Report: After 22 weeks of giving, revenue is above expected and expenses are tracking with the current budget overall. The list of our current benevolences was shared. Discussion was held regarding benevolence designees and how they are chosen. Lane will be on vacation the last part of June. Nancy Loftis will be her back up while she is out. The Audit Committee has met and is coming up with suggestions to improve our budget reporting processes.

COUNCIL ROUNDTABLE:

Fellowship: Report was submitted. It was decided to have Pr Scott make an announcement on Sunday to highlight the FAST team interest sheets. Hopefully this will result in a bigger response for volunteers.

Outreach: The prayer chain is functioning and is valuable. The prayer group is growing but there's always room for more. We continue to look for volunteers to man the Welcome/Opportunity Desk. We continue to expand the Care Team as the need arises.

Preschool: Report was submitted. The preschool is full for all classes for the fall. Graduation is scheduled for June 15th. Maggie has asked that the youth of the church remove the wood chips under the playground as a potential fundraiser.

Social Ministry: Anne has put in a grant request to cover the cost of additional turkey roasters for the Christmas dinner.

WELCA: The Strawberry Social is June 27th. Jeanette, as funeral coordinator, asked for more specific details regarding funerals prior to the services to help in planning and serving. Sewing is going well. There will be quilts for Senior Sunday this week.

Worship: Report was submitted.

Youth: Credit card usage was discussed.

President's Report: John shared data regarding attendance numbers for worship. We are averaging 138 people per Sunday. We are waiting to hear from Ministry Works regarding the Covid reimbursement and also the synod grants we applied for. News should be coming shortly. Thank you to Don Devine and Paul Dusenbury for updating our outdoor church signage to reflect current worship times. Thanks also to Wayne Olsen for updating the electrical wires in the altar area. John is working out final details regarding our fire alarm monitoring company. We need to pay Evergreen Service for two quarters of fire system monitoring. Going forward we will be contracted with Fire Chief Services. Jobun and Kenny have a great working relationship with the Youth. We are excited with what youth plans they have offered and continue to add. A new computer for the youth room will be added. Prime Timers continue to be active.

Pastor's Report: Report was submitted. He will be going on vacation and we will have a substitute for the one Sunday he will miss. VBS plans are underway.

OLD BUSINESS:

John reported on open items still needing action.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Youth Dynamics Request: We were asked as a church to help financially support a Youth Dynamics employee. The
 decision was made to table this discussion until our next meeting while we wait on grant money decisions to come
 in. MSP

FROM BISHOP SHELLEY BRYAN WEE -The Spirit July - August 2023

From the Bishop:

As I write this, I am still re-living a beautiful experience that I had last weekend. Five of my friends and I drove to the Gorge Amphitheatre and we saw Joni Mitchell in concert. For some of you, this might be interesting, for others, you might not even know who Joni Mitchell is. For me, the time was filled with joy, laughter, tears, friendship, and community ... not to mention amazing music and storytelling.

But this isn't about Joni Mitchell ... at least not entirely. For what struck me as I sat on the grass with 26,000 other people, was the church-like feeling that was there. Or perhaps I should say the "Jesusy" feeling that was there. Or maybe the Holy Spirit in action feeling. And this came from the crowd itself.

As we all sat crowded together on blankets and chairs, people told stories, shared food and drink, sang songs, helped those who were having difficulty navigating the hillside, and together we became community. The little children sitting to the right of me danced, the young girls sitting to the left of me accepted blankets from my friend, and the man in front of me told me that he had traveled from North Carolina to see Joni. He told me that he was surprised to discover the Gorge was not located in Seattle!

There was one point in the concert, after it had gotten dark, when Joni was singing and people – one by one – started shining the flashlight from their cellphones towards the stage. Throughout the crowd, little points of light lit up the darkness. Now, if you have been to a concert in the last ten years, this is a common occurrence. Cell phone lights have taken the place of lighters being raised. However, because Joni has not performed in over twenty years, she was bemused by the lights. She turned to the person next to her on stage and said, "It looks like a fallen constellation. Where did they get all those lights?"

I thought her words and her surprise were charming. But as I looked around me, at the people sharing blankets, at those with arms around each other swaying to the music, at the cozy darkness around us and the lights looking like fallen stars, it was more than charming. It was holy.

For a moment, we were a cathedral. For a moment, we were community. For a moment, we were one.

At our best, this is what it means to be church. To be the Body of Christ. To practice hospitality and generosity, and grace. To see Christ in one another. To accept others' limitations and to be accepting of our own.

I confess that all was not perfect at the Gorge. There was a person close to me who insisted on singing every word to every song. While her voice was fine, I was not there to hear her but to hear Joni. There were people who cut in line after we had been waiting two hours to get inside. There was a driver who bullied his way into the front of the very long line of vehicles as we were leaving.

Perhaps this is like church, too. At least church as a human construction. Those of us who have been part of a church for a while, we know that church is not always sharing blankets and food, singing and joy. Sometimes, as humans, we hoard our stuff. We take offense at others. We refuse to listen. We bully. We push. Our voices sometimes drown out other voices.

And yet ... I pray that the moments of grace we receive this summer – from music at the Gorge to singing lustily in church, from sharing food on a hillside to receiving the body and blood of Christ – may we be church together. May we know and make it known that all are fully loved by God – in the times when we are like fallen constellations and in the times we are not.

May your summer be filled with holy moments.
