

#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SCOTT

Anacortes Lutheran Church March 2022 Newsletter

Dear Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,

As the calendar turns to the month of March and we start looking forward to the changes that Spring will show us, we also see a change in the seasons of the Church. As we turn this page of celebrating the glory shown on the mountain and seeing the transfiguration of Christ, we now turn to the season of Lent. A season that begins with that deeply moving day of Ash Wednesday. The day we are once again reminded of our mortality, reminded that we are here but for a short time, and begin our walk toward the Cross of Christ.

Lent is perhaps my favorite season of the Church Year. Some may be more connected to the seasons of Christmas or Easter, but for me the 40 days that we spend on this journey is a time where change can happen in our lives (if we let it). 40 days is enough time to start a new discipline. 40 days is enough to change a habit that may not serve as a benefit to our lives. 40 days is enough time to begin to explore our lives, both individually and as community, as we learn who we are in Christ. Sometimes Lent feels long and tiring, and sometimes it may hurry by as we learn something new.

For those of you who have a tradition of 'giving something up' for Lent, I would invite you this year to do something different. I would invite you to take on something new. Reading a chapter a day from one of the Gospels or the epistles of Paul, or maybe reading through the book of Proverbs over the course of the season.

Maybe you will be able to gather with us at the Thursday (noon) or Sunday (11:15 am) Bible studies. I would like to use these times (each week we will be doing the same things on Thursday and Sunday, so you can pick the one you are able to get to) to reflect on the realities at ALC over the last years and to perhaps work on some healing of the trauma that has been so evident in our lives. We will let scripture guide us into opening ourselves to God and the strength and comfort that God gives.

Maybe you will read more, or cook more, or play an instrument for a few more minutes each day. Use the season of Lent to start something new, so when we get to that joyous Easter morning, when all things become new, we may indeed be a bit new as well.

You are also invited to gather on Wednesdays for a time of worship. We will begin on March 2nd with our Ash Wednesday worship at 12-noon and 6:30 pm, and then continue on Wednesdays at 6:30 pm with Holden Evening Prayer.



### **ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - FEBRUARY 10, 2022**

The meeting was held via Zoom due to Covid concerns. It was called to order at 6:35 PM by John Parker followed by an opening prayer. MSP January minutes were approved.

**Treasurer's Report**: Fiscal year began January I. We had record giving for January. Lane will put together a list of who do you contact to spend available funds. The list would be available to council and staff.

**Pastor's Report**: Pastor will begin a Lenten Bible study to be held Thursdays at noon, and to be repeated after Sunday services for those who can't make it on Thursday. Theme will be on "Reflection and Healing". There will be a benefit concert this Saturday at the Brown Lantern for Lois Cassidy's grandson. Pastor Scott is readying a new member class, first communion class, and a Lutheran 101 class. Youth Dynamics approached us. They are looking for groups to help monetarily sponsor a gala event at the end of April.

  to hold soup suppers will be a last minute decision due to current and ever changing COVID restrictions

- Social Media Posting protocol: the secretary heads up the church website. Becky heads up Facebook posts. Further specifics will be discussed at our upcoming retreat.
- Creating a new Member Roster/Photo Board: Kathy Khile is interested in working on this project. This project has the potential to work with our Church Windows software.

- Installation of 2022 Council will be during the Sunday service on Feb 27<sup>th</sup>.

  council members. ACTION ITEMS: Bill volunteered to provide a copy of the church constitution and job
  description to all new council members. Anita will update the email list and get it sent out to all council
