Anacortes Lutheran Church Council Minutes for June 13, 2024

Attendees: Pastor Scott, Steve Anderson, Anne Barry, Jeaneen Brogan, Don Devine, Julie Jacobson, Lane Phelan, Pat Carrie Smith

The meeting was called to order and Pastor Scott opened with prayer. May minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: A written report was handed out and reviewed together. We are meeting our financial obligations in these first 6 months of the year. Our income vs expenses will be published in the Scoop, it could be a weekly account rather than the year-to-date. The Finance committee met and will look into purchasing a copy of Quick Books to better update the account titles and line item numbers and it will also be easier to consolidate the monthly reports. Cost for the program can come from the Computer Upgrade Budget under Stewardship.

Pastor's Report: A written report was submitted. Note Pastor will be on vacation for the month of August. So far two of the four Sundays are filled with pulpit supply, the other two are being worked on.

Stewardship: Bill was absent but sent in a written report.

Worship: A written report was submitted. Laurie may contact someone to lead hand drum circles this summer, with the intent of inviting the community to participate.

Property: A written report was submitted. Rebuild kits have been ordered to replace old parts in the toilets. Security lights need new batteries as some were no longer working. Tomorrow the fire chief is coming to check the backflow preventers. Tomorrow someone else will clean out the grease trap which hasn't been done for 7 years. An idea was given to have a window washing day and invite volunteers to come in and help sometime this summer.

Preschool: A written report was submitted. The preschool graduation was today. Any scholarship monies still owed will be paid through the Anacortes Foundation and our own scholarship fund which the preschool has paid into in the past.

Personnel: The nursery has a full roster of employees again. There is a new person hired who will create the Sunday slides once a month, Becky Eggleston takes care of the other three weeks.

Youth: Michael was absent. It was suggested to create a youth calendar of events and post it around the church as another way of communication.

WELCA: Jeanette was absent so Jeaneen reported that the Strawberry Social is happening on Tuesday June 18 and there will be live music as well as a basket for a free-will offering to offset the rising cost of strawberries. There will be a picnic in the Fellowship Hall in August for all women to attend.

Fellowship: It was noted that the summer Wednesday picnics have been set up by Chuck and Bev Landgraf as reservations need to be made and begin on July 10. The annual corn feed will be on a Thursday due to scheduling conflicts at Washington Park.

Old Business:

Recruiting continues to fill council positions - please let Don know of any persons you may have in mind. Open
positions are Education (Heather has done a lot of work so this person has a head start on the fall education),
Fellowship, Outreach and President-Elect. Don will publish some job descriptions to put in the back of the church
as well as make an announcement on Sunday..

New Business:

• A constitution working group has been created and includes Pastor, Paul Dusenbury, Rosemary Walter, Anita Holzemer and Dave Bjornson. Lane Phelan will participate when the synod specialist meets with them.

Council Minutes for June 13, 2024 continued...

- Pastor introduced a program called "One Parish, One Prisoner", the purpose of the program is to connect a
 church with a soon to be released prisoner to give that person a bigger community to come into when they are
 out, increasing their success rate of staying out of prison. A couple of other local churches are involved with this.
 Pastor will meet with someone to get more information on what the commitments look like.
- Steve has a stash of T12 lightbulb tubes that will be excess once all of our lights get changed out by PSE to LEDs.
 He suggests putting out a can for donations to the parking lot fund when people take the bulbs for personal use.
 (These are the bulbs that are used in garages etc.) Pastor checks in with PSE monthly as we are still waiting to hear when this changeover will take place.
- Discussion took place about getting back a youth council representative to serve a 2 year term on council, ideally
 a 10th grader who could do this for two years. The constitution also allows for someone 18-30 to be on council
 to represent that age group. Michael can give input on this and if there are suggestions of people who may be
 interested, let Don know.

Anne moved to adjourn the meeting.

Our next regular council meeting will be held August 8 at 6:30 pm. Please have committee reports into Julie no later than midnight on Tuesday, August 6. There will be no July Council meeting.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

From the Bishop:

Martin Luther writes in the Small Catechism:

What then does 'daily bread' mean? Everything included in the necessities and nourishment for our bodies, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, farm, field, livestock, money, property, an upright spouse, upright children, upright members of the household, upright and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, decency, honor, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like. (Small Catechism, Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer)

In May, the six bishops of Region One (this includes the synods of Northwest Washington, Southwestern Washington, Alaska, Oregon, Northwest Intermountain, and Montana) were asked by the Region One hunger teams to write a joint letter requesting Congress to re-authorize the federal Farm Bill and to not cut important funding. The six bishops agreed to write this letter. After it was written and signed, the ELCA Advocacy staff in Washington, DC hand-delivered it to the House and Senate Agriculture Committees' leaderships and to the Representatives in each of the synod's respective states.

In June, there was a zoom event for all the Lutherans in the six synods to learn more about the Farm Bill and advocate for its continuation. This event was sponsored by the Region One hunger ministry teams, ELCA Advocacy, and Faith Action Network (FAN). Different speakers shared information, conversation happened, and the opportunity to write letters to legislators occurred.

As you might know, the six synods have over 560 congregations and tens of thousands of Lutherans from the states of Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming. These synods and states are not homogenous. The bishops are not homogenous. The congregations within each synod are not homogenous. The members of these congregations are not homogenous. We have differences of opinion at times, we have different priorities, we vote differently, we even shake our heads at things that don't make sense to us about one another.

And yet, in our diversity, we are also joined in the unity of Christ and the promises we have received. Deep in our bones, we know that we are saved by grace through faith. We hold fast to the truth that God loves us no matter what. We know this and trust this and hold this. And, because of this, together we are called out into the world – as followers of Jesus and as civic members of society.

We join together – over and over – to bring about change and protect the vulnerable. We come together beyond political difference because of what we have been promised and what we are called to do and to be. The example I've been using in this article is the Farm Bill. When we advocate for this bi-partisan Farm Bill, we are advocating for farmers, migrants, agricultural workers, Indigenous peoples, hungry children, the inclusion of those who have been historically excluded, and more.

But, of course, we come together far beyond this Farm Bill. We come together because God calls us to love others as God loves us. We work together for a just society. As German pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "Mere waiting and looking on is not Christian behavior. Christians are called to compassion and action, not in the first place by their own sufferings, but by the sufferings of their brothers and sisters, for whose sake Christ suffered." (A Testament to Freedom)

I am thankful and proud to be Lutheran because of all of you who feed and clothe, nourish and shelter, love and protect those who are the most vulnerable in this country and this world. It would take pages to list all the ways that you do this individually, in your congregations, in the synod, and in the wider church. Thank you for your advocacy and your care. There is, of course, more work to be done. And so let us together work towards the day when all may receive "daily bread."
