

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SCOTT

Anacortes Lutheran Church December 2021 Newsletter

Greetings in the Name of Christ!

Well, I made it! I have started the process of figuring out all the different ministries that are going on and how the regular schedule happens. For the next few months (probably many more) I will be doing a lot of observation and asking of questions. I will be trying to learn about this new culture of life and ministry in Anacortes and how I can best become a part of it. As many of you heard at the Question and Response gathering we had following the worship service on October 3rd (or perhaps watched the YouTube replay), coming to the Pacific Northwest has been something Gina and I have been thinking about for over 25 years. It is good to be here!

I will use this first article to let you know a little more about myself so that when you see me doing something 'peculiar' you may think to yourself, "Oh, yeah, he did mention that in the newsletter article."

Here goes:

I was born in Minnesota and spent most of my first 25 years there. I did go to Disneyland and Disneyworld with my aunt and younger brother, but other than that Minnesota was where I existed. Summers were often spent camping, spending times with friends, and swimming and boating (we lived on a small lake). The rest of the year often centered around school and church. I am one of those 'cradle Lutherans' who has spent much time in the circles of faith and the Church, and perhaps knows a little too much about the quirkiness that the Lutheran faith brings to Christianity. After spending university (Augsburg College) and seminary (Luther Seminary) in the Minneapolis/St. Paul Area, Gina and I moved out to rural Montana for our first call experience. Spending three years there was a time of learning how even congregations that were close in proximity geographically could vary widely in their expression of the Lutheran faith (it was a 3-point parish). We also learned how to help with harvesting, insemination of cattle, and building relationships with the neighboring Hutterite colonies. We learned how important faith was when you were in farming and ranching, as so much was out of your control.

After living in Montana, we made a move up to Calgary, Alberta, Canada (Gina was employed by U.S. Immigration) and spent the next 17+ years learning what it meant to live in a foreign country as an American,

learning how the metric system made so much sense, learning and experiencing what a Chinook wind was, learning the sport of curling and underwater hockey, and so much more. If you are interested, we would be willing to share much more about our time there. While in Calgary, our daughter Sophie was born and has now grown into a wonderful young woman studying at California Lutheran University in Thousand Oaks, CA. After spending 14+ years serving a congregation in Calgary, we returned to the US with a move to California. Living in Los Angeles has been one of the hardest, and most exciting, times of our lives. We have seen so much in the 5 years we have lived and worked in LA that it is hard to believe that we are in another transition. One of the highlights of our time in LA was learning about being a background actor. If you would like to know the productions that Sophie and I (only working one production in common) have been a part of we would be willing to go down the list. You may have seen either of us on your TV screen before you ever knew you would see us in person!

There is so much to share, and now we will have the time to build those relationships and share of ourselves with one another. We will grow together through all that life will bring into our lives, and we will do it together. We have been called by God into this life, and work of ministry, and we will pray, share, and hope for what God has in store for us in the coming years.

It is a blessing to be with you, and may we be a blessing to the world around us!

STEWARDSHIP REPORT - John Parker

Stewardship is defined as the job of taking care of something - protecting it. Like the tribes of Israel who protected and nurtured the Ark of the Covenant across the Sinai desert for 40 years, we all are guardians and Stewards of the concept, taught to us by Christ, which promises us the boundless love of God. This Church is our "Ark." And we have the sacred duty (and the joy!) to protect it, nurture it, and maintain it. Our reward is to live safely here, bathed in the love of our extended Church Family. Every year at this time, we plan our activities for the coming year, and estimate our income and expenses to accomplish that mission - the faithful stewardship of this Ark. This year's Budget Planning is proceeding well, and a Comprehensive Budget proposal will be made to the Church Council in early December. We know a few things will be exciting as we go through this process:

- I) First and Happiest, we enter the new year welcoming a wonderful new spiritual leader. We are blessed to have found such a strong and experienced Pastor. Pastor Scott will provide a fresh and valuable perspective as we develop a final draft for presentation to the Congregation in January.
- 2) There are several high dollar building maintenance items that must be attended to, such as stained glass window repair, furnace replacement, foundation/drain sealing and repair, and parking lot paving, just to name a few.
- 3) Our Anacortes Lutheran Preschool budgeting and operations will be fully incorporated in the overall Church budget and this will be a powerful planning aid. Anacortes Lutheran Preschool is widely regarded as the best in the city.
- 4) Finally, we anticipate annual operating expenses will increase at least 10% over last year. But the last two years have not been typical in any way, and predictions based on recent costs will be subject to a lot of uncertainty. Please consider increasing your regular giving. Ten percent would be wonderful, everything will be a blessing.

Please join us in thanking them both. You may bring cards and thoughts of thankfulness.




THE SALVATION ARMY ANGEL TREE



ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - NOVEMBER 11, 2021

Attendees: Dave Bjornson, Jeaneen Brogan, Jeanette Christensen, Kendra Kennedy, Anita Holzemer, Bill LeDuc, Les Olsen, John Parker, Lane Phelan, Peggy White.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Bill LeDuc followed by an opening prayer.

October council minutes were corrected to reflect a requested monthly rate for the parking lot usage. It should have been \$375, not the listed \$450. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Currently we are in the black. Third quarter benevolences are yet to be paid. We expect offerings to rise as people return once we have a new pastor.

President's Report: A thank you was received from Pr Walt. Our Boy Scout troop has been asked to weed the parking lot. We will provide the tools, and they will weed and paint the stripes. A thank you was sent to the Sahnow's for cleaning and painting the front steps.

Old Business:

- 1. South Wall Repair Part I has begun. Money in the maintenance budget will cover initial costs.
- 2. The Legacy Endowment Fund has made two donations from their local mission funds: \$2000 to Josephine Sunset Home and \$1000 to El Camino de Emaus.
- 3. The church has purchased a business Zoom license. Please coordinate with Rachel to arrange use.
- 4. Tentative plans for an appreciation for Mirth Moore and Dave White has been set for Sunday, Dec 5 following the children's sermon.
- 5. FAST team ideas? A list for volunteer readers is at the back of the church. An informal sign-up process will remain at the back of the church for now. We will revisit the process after the first of the year.
- 6. New toilets for basement are not needed. Water was just turned off. One stool was removed and capped off; the other two will be turned back on.
- 7. The church has an Amazon account. There is some question on if we have one account or two one for our Smile account and one for our Kindle. Kendra will follow up. Reminder that all orders need to be coordinated and placed through Rachel.
- 8. Upstairs computer is working and online. We are working with the Church Windows software and will be transitioning to its contributions module.

New Business

- Welcoming Committee for Pr Scott: We currently have three volunteers. More volunteers are needed.
 Please call the church office or contact a council rep to volunteer. Office set up and supplies are being
 coordinated by Rachel and Pr Deborah. We will wait until Pr Scott arrives to see what technology needs
 there are.
- 2. Arrangements for Service on Nov 21st: A welcome email will be sent from synod. Ads have been placed in the Clamdigger and Anacortes American announcing the new pastor's arrival. Sandwich board will be set out front.
- 3. Heat upstairs for Sunday School area. Les will look into turning it back on for Sunday School and the offering counters.
- 4. Brainstorming ideas on what we would like the new pastor to concentrate on when he arrives. Ideas suggested include: Gathering the congregation after Covid and death of Pr Benson. Reigniting the youth program. Picture directory. Small group congregational meetings. Meet with finance team re: budget, future plans, potential audit/ financial review. Bible studies. Confirmation. Live stream/social media involvement. Streamline communications with staff/council. Get involved with staff and staff oversight. Involvement with council and leadership. Get a building tour from Les.

- 5. Thank you notes to Call Committee members will be sent. Peggy White will provide the cards and put them in Bill's box for signature. Council members need to look for them there and sign them.
- 6. MSP for a fundraiser for foundation repair. John Parker will kick off the fundraiser on Sunday, Nov 14th. More details to follow in the newsletter.

Committee Reports:

Worship: Final details on our Advent schedule will wait until Pr Scott arrives. Clip nametags have been generously donated. Advent service live stream would be done, but on a volunteer basis. Worship will investigate streamlining the sign-in process to prevent long lines of people waiting to check in.

<u>Outreach</u>: An Opportunity Counter on wheels is proposed to facilitate sharing information with visitors. This committee has many activities involving the Prayer Group and Prayer Chain, in-home member visitation, bulletin board update, Christmas dinner, and Operation Shoebox, media greetings for Pastor Scott, Evangelism Seminar series, new Visitor Guides, and new signage for visitors.

Education: Confirmation currently meets Sunday mornings from 9-10. They will be taking December off and will resume in January. Currently they have up to 9 members. Christmas store donations are being collected and a Thrivent card has been donated to help with expenses. Currently Sunday School has 5-11 kids and 1-2 teachers. Bible Presentations will be done on Dec 5th. Christmas program rehearsals are starting. Tree decorating: It was suggested to let the kids decorate the bottom half. Save the fragile ornaments to be added later.

<u>Personnel</u>: Pr Deborah's contract will not be renewed due to budget constraints. It is currently set to expire at the end of January. She will make plans to visit all members currently on the prayer list. Council Agenda item for December: Discuss a thank you for her. Live stream team is looking for feed back. 

BISHOPS MESSAGE - The Spirit December 2021

Miriam sings, "Sing to the Lord, for God has triumphed gloriously!" Exodus 15:21 Hannah sings, "My heart exults in the LORD; my strength is exalted in my God!" I Samuel 2:1 Mary sings, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior!" Luke 1:46

I am so grateful for the stories of Miriam, Hannah, and Mary. I love their spirit. I love their faith. I love their songs. I love that even with the great adversity, sorrow, and difficulty each of them endured, Miriam, Hannah, and Mary defiantly sang.

Each of these women's stories unfolded in a world that seemed bleak. A world of systemic injustice and no safety nets. A world where people upheld their own power to the detriment of others. A world where people refused to see another person made in God's image before them. A world where people threw away people because they were perceived as "less than." A world where people threw away people because they could not bear children. A world where people threw away people because they became pregnant without being married.

And while their experiences are not our experiences, for many still today, the world feels desperate.

Today, so many people are living in dire conditions. So many who are hungry, houseless, voiceless. We have injustice and violence, racism and hatred. We have anger and acrimony. We have the spreading of lies and misinformation. As I write this, our world is grieving the deaths of over 5 million people who have died of COVID. Over 100,000 people died of drug overdoses in the United States this past year. And so many other deaths and losses. There are still people that society throws away. There are still people that other people don't even look at as human.

And yet ... And yet ...

We have Miriam, Hannah, and Mary. We have their defiant voices lifted up singing not only to their world in their time – but beyond their time – to us – and to future generations beyond us.

In this Advent time, let us turn to the stories and the songs of Miriam, Hannah, and Mary. Let us remember their prophetic voices. Let us remember their perseverance, their faith, and their grit. For even as the reality around them was difficult, they continued to sing of a new day, a new promise, a new reality.

May these amazing prophet women bring hope to us in this time. May we remember that new life is coming. May we trust that the world now is not how the world will be. May we hold before us that, through Christ, a new day is being born.

In this Advent time, we live in anticipation and in faith. And we sing. We sing.
