

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SCOTT

Anacortes Lutheran Church January 2022 Newsletter

"O Lord, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. Out of the mouths of babes and infants you have founded a bulwark because of your foes, to silence the enemy and the avenger. When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas. O Lord, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" – Psalm 8

January Ist this year is celebrated in the Church as the festival of the Holy Name of Jesus. Psalm 8, which began this article is the appointed psalm for the day. I believe that there is no better way to begin the year than by remembering that we follow Jesus and hope to walk in his ways. January Ist is also the 8th day of the season of Christmas. We often forget that Christmas (like Easter) is a season and not just a celebration of one or two days, but we also forget to hold that feeling of hope and expectation from Advent into the coming Epiphany season.

I have always been surprised that some people feel that church is boring or "not for me". I wonder what would make 'church' more palatable or fun. And that gets me thinking about what we think of as church. For many, it is the <u>building</u> that holds our times of worship and other milestones like baptisms, weddings, and funerals. For some, it is the Sunday morning <u>worship service</u> when we tell others that, "we are going to church." And those who are more interested in the Augsburg Confession, may think of it as "The Church is the congregation of saints, in which the Gospel is rightly taught and the Sacraments are rightly administered." (Article 7)

I believe the important part of that last definition is the word "congregation". As you see it is not capitalized, which makes one think that it is used as a verb. It is the coming together of the people of God that makes us church. We are the church as we gather. We are the church when we assemble to share our lives with one another. Does it need to be at 10am on a Sunday morning? No. Although gathering for the rituals of worship is very important. We are led from confession to benediction, through the Word and sharing of Communion, to remember who we are as God's people and followers of Jesus.

So where else do we find 'church'? We find it in the Sunday School classroom when students and teachers share the love of God. It is found at the choir practice where people gather to sing and praise and pray. It is the Bible Study that meets to explore the Word of God. It is the Council meeting. It is the dinner table where we stop to say thanks for the blessings in our lives. It is the hospital room. It is the front yard where we greet the neighbor.

Are you getting the idea? Church is where we gather to share and give of ourselves to one another as people of God. I was once asked if it is church "when I am on the mountain or in the forest or at the shoreline and feel close to God?" I gently answered, "no." That is not church, but it is a time of prayer and communion with God. It is a time important to our lives as spiritual beings and I would not take those moments away. But it is not 'church'. (Maybe take one or two friends with you, then it may become church— for as Matthew I8:20 says, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.")

As we begin this new year of 2022, let us gather together (keeping COVID protocols in mind) and give thanks for the blessings of God in our lives.

A FAREWELL MESSAGE - Pastor Deborah Butler

To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heavens ...

When I started as Visitation Pastor in March, 2018, I envisioned mostly spending time with shut-ins and people dealing with illness, and leading worship once a month, working in partnership with Pastor Benson. It was to be a season of retirement with some pastoral work added on so I could continue to serve the church. I was looking forward to pastoral ministry without administrative responsibility and lots of meetings!

There's a saying which goes, 'You know how to make God laugh? Tell God your plans.' I doubt God was laughing, but my plans certainly didn't go as expected. I imagined enjoying an easy balance of retirement and pastoral ministry. None of us ever envisioned that cancer was going to strike Pastor Benson and take her from us. None of us—especially me—ever expected the call to come for me to take on the role of full-time Respite Pastor from August 2019 until May 2020. It was a season of painful loss, and it was a season where we still continued to faithfully do God's work. It was a season where we loved and cared for one another in our time of grief. I was happy to welcome Pastor Walt Rice to our community as Transition Pastor and figured I would be back to pastoral care and once-a-month worship leadership.

Then came COVID. All the expectations for the season of transition to a new called pastor were upset as we had to rely on zoom and videos and livestream for worship and meetings. The whole staff pitched in to ensure worship continued, and together we spent many hours figuring out how to manage technology and planning and recording and zooming in order to keep the ministry of our church going. And, thankfully, dedicated staff and volunteers, in fact all of you who are part of the ALC family, managed to do that. It was, and still is, a season of disruption and concern for the well-being of our siblings here and around the globe. It is a season when we are called to embody the risen Christ to our neighbors by our loving service

Now we welcome Pastor Scott Peterson to lead the people of Anacortes Lutheran into a new and exciting season of ministry! I believe the Spirit has led Pastor Scott to ALC and that he will be a blessing to this faith community.

Now there will be a new season for me as my time as Visitation Pastor will come to an end on January 31. January 9th will be my last Sunday leading worship. It has been a privilege to serve as your pastor. I am grateful for the support and encouragement you have offered me. Jay and I are especially thankful for the love you have shown us after the death of our son, James.

I'm still going to be here in Anacortes, so we'll meet at the grocery store and elsewhere. Jay will be available to help with your hardware needs at Sebo's and your sailing needs at Butler Rigging. And, of course, I will continue to pray for you in all the seasons of life and ministry in all the years to come.

May God's peace be with you always.

ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - DECEMBER 9, 2021

Attendees: Dave Bjornson, Jeaneen Brogan, Jeanette Christensen, Kendra Kennedy, Anita Holzemer, Bill LeDuc, Les Olsen, John Parker, Lane Phelan, Peggy White and Pastor Scott Peterson

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by Bill LeDuc followed by a short devotional and opening prayer. November minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Currently we are covering all our expenses. General giving is up in general. \$18,000 has been raised so far for the foundation repair. Preschool funds have now been transferred into Heritage Bank. Third quarter benevolences will be paid soon. MSP to designate our Christmas benevolences to include Lutherwood, Helping Hands Food Bank, and Whatcom County flood relief.

President's Report: Items listed are below under Old Business.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Scott continues to meet small groups over dinners. He has started conducting preschool chapel. His family will be moving here by Christmas. A prearranged vacation is scheduled for Jan 6-15, 2022. As a result, we will move our next council meeting to Jan 20.

Old Business:

- 1. Parking Lot Scout Maintenance Project: Painting of the new stripes has been put on hold until after the rainy season. Weed pulling will be scheduled soon.
- 2. South Wall Repair Phase I has been completed. Phase 2 will start when dryer weather arrives. Properties will keep an eye on drainage for now during rainy season. Suggest they start on downspouts for now since we have the funds on hand. MSP to proceed with Phase 2 based on receipt of a reasonable estimate.
- 3. FASTeam discussion: It was decided to hold off resumption of FASTeams until we have a Fellowship chair. For now, a sign-up sheet for readers continues to work. A sign-up sheet will also be placed in the Fellowship Hall for Sunday morning treat donations. Anita will coordinate with the office to arrange a sign-up form.
- 4. It continues to be cold upstairs in the offering counting room. Les will check the portable heater situation.

- 2022 Budget: John Parker presented the 2022 Budget. MSP to accept the budget and present it to the
 congregation at the annual meeting. Discussion was held on personnel contracts timeframe. MSP to keep

 their new contract in July.

To do that we will need to switch alarm monitoring companies. Kevin Kennedy can supply quotes for less expensive phone systems. Les will follow up.
- 5. The Nominating Committee has met. It currently has two members. They met and brainstormed names. Openings for the upcoming year include President, President Elect, Worship chair, Fellowship chair, and Youth chair. We are also looking for a confirmed youth member to serve as a youth representative on council.
- 6. The 2022 Annual Meeting will be held Sunday, February 6 following service.

FROM THE BISHOP - The Spirit January 2022

During this winter, as many continue to grapple with - and be discouraged by - the continuation of the pandemic, isolation, discontent, and loneliness, we might feel that our relationships are not as strong as they once were – with family and friends, with colleagues and co-workers, and with those in our church.

Recently I read a book called Tempered Resilience by Tod Bolsinger. While I wasn't enthralled with the whole book, I did resonate with one visual that he used and perhaps you will find helpful in this time, too. He writes about how our different relationships help us in our resilience and in our on-going ability to adapt. On page I I 2 Bolsinger writes, "To flourish in ministry or other forms of social leadership, leaders need to be conscious of at least three different contexts, and the relationships needed to flourish in those contexts, 'front stage, backstage, and offstage."

The <u>Front Stage</u> is the public face that we show to the world. It is the place where "performance" happens. It is critical to have trustworthy colleagues or teammates where you are able to be yourself. These relationships could include peers and teammates, partners, and colleagues. An example from scripture would be the disciples. Who would you include in your life?

The <u>Back Stage</u> is the place to support and nurture you in your "front stage" work. Good front stage work depends on lots of time backstage analyzing and thinking about the work that is being done, learning from the lessons of success and failure from others, and especially, gaining perspective from experienced leaders. In his book Bolsinger cautions, "Backstage relationships don't happen because of others. They happen because of you." (p. 116) In other words, you might have to seek out "backstage people. Backstage relationships include therapists, coaches, mentors, spiritual directors, pastors, and more. An example in scripture would be David listening to Samuel or Moses listening to his father-in-law Jethro or Ruth listening to Naomi. Who would you include in your life?

The Off Stage are the people that you are emotionally closest to and who are your confidents. As Bolsinger writes, "The quality of your relationships with other people influences how emotionally resilient you can be in the face of an emotional or physical crisis. In general, the more quality social support you can draw upon from family and friends, the more flexible and resilient you can be in stressful situations." (p. 120) An example in scripture would be Elizabeth and Mary. Who would you include in your life?

So, I'm wondering, how are doing in these three areas? Are your relationships strong "front stage, backstage, and offstage"? Do you have good connections? Where could you form deeper connections? Where do you need help in forming new relationships?

I'd love to hear from you how we can be a more connected church community, how we can support one another, and how resilience can be built up by forming and growing relationships.

I know this is a difficult and frustrating time for many. I feel it, too. May you feel connected with one another. May you feel upheld by one another. And, especially, in this Epiphany season, may God's presence, love and grace be made known to you.
