Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,

The month of February has always been one of my favorite months. Why is that, you ask? Groundhog Day? Nope. Valentine's Day? Nope. Yukon Heritage Day? Closer...

Maybe it is my Lutheran upbringing, but it is Ash Wednesday! That day when we are reminded of our mortality and begin our pilgrimage into the season of Lent. The day when ashes are placed upon our forehead as a sign. The day when we put away the "alleluias" and turn our hearts toward repentance. The day when it seems the music all goes into a minor key.

I hear some of you saying, "Wow, you must be fun at parties." (It turns out I am) But I have found that by accepting mortality as a reality of our lives frees me to actually live better. In our Western society we spend an awful lot of time and energy to distract us away from death and dying. We spend millions and billions of dollars to keep ourselves 'young', or at least looking that way, thinking that we may just cheat death and win it all. The truth, however, is that none of us make it out of life alive.

Very early in our lives, at least if we have grown up in a church that does infant baptisms, we were joined to the "death and resurrection of Christ" as those waters cascaded down upon our heads. Yes, resurrection is part of the story, but death is the factor that we cannot miss. In baptism we 'die' to ourselves and are reborn children of God. Death is an integral part of who we are as followers of Jesus. And death is a very sacred reality. I have been at the bedside of a number of people as they took their last breath. It is a moment when the presence of God is tangible and the silence brings peace that surpasses all understanding. Yes, it is also filled with grief and sadness, but the presence of God makes even the tears falling down our cheeks into droplets of holy water.

For many the beginning of Lent brings up feelings of trepidation and even fear. We are called to come face to face with our mortality and to even embrace it. But by accepting our mortality we are free to embrace the abundant life that we are given in Christ even more. We are freed to enter into the season of Lent and grab on to the gift of repentance and forgiveness. We may find beauty in the sound of a hymn in a minor key. We may be filled with anticipation at the return of "Alleluia!" to our lips. We may find in the ashes on our foreheads a promise of palms being waved in celebration of Jesus in our lives. We may even find the power of resurrection breaking into our daily lives as we share the gift of love with our neighbors. And may we all find blessings in returning to God in each moment knowing that we are loved.

May the coming season bless you in your pilgrimage toward the Cross!

FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT – John Parker

Happy New Year to us all! I'm hopeful you all had a blessed Christmas season. It gift-wrapped a very successful year for Anacortes Lutheran. Now, we have this Council meeting and one more to finalize planning for next year before the Congregational Meeting on February 12. As always, this meeting has a large influence on the coming year, so it's our responsibility to make it as smooth and productive as possible.

There are Three major things for us to address at this month's meeting:

- First and Foremost The 2023 Budget: Embedded in the budget vote are three key financial decisions.
 - Express our commitment to increase staff emphasis on coordinating Youth and Education programs by allocating \$28,000 for hiring a part time Director of Youth and Young Adult Activities.
 - Free up \$650/month of cash flow by consolidating some cash reserves and pre-pay the current mortgage on the Pre-School.
 - A 10% across the board increase for church staff effective April 1, 2023.
- <u>Second and just as critical Recruiting Council Leadership for the coming year:</u> There are four Open Committee Chair Positions going into the New Year.
 - ◆ Education Sunday School/VBS/Confirmation
 - Youth Ministry Youth (4th thru 12th grade), Young Singles, and Young Families
 - Fellowship Coffee Hour/Prime Timers/General Congregational Events
 - Properties Management of the maintenance and protection of the church property

It's my opinion that the first two positions, education and youth ministry, overlap and some redefinition clarification of roles is required and will aid in recruiting. In the meantime, we have to go into the Congregational meeting with an incomplete slate and a promise to keep on trying to fill these slots.

• Third - Online Worship is a growing part of our Sunday attendance: Depending on how you estimate the online audience, it accounts for about 40% of the Sunday Service attendance. There's reason to consider increasing our technical hardware capability and exploring ways to expand this ministry. It might start with creating a new Council position for Communications.

The Year-End Statistics for 2022 are very satisfying. You can be very proud of your accomplishments. Financially we were right on target, but an aggressive budget is going to require us all to consider increasing our stewardship and encourage our fellow members to do the same. So my message this month is: Enjoy the rewards of all your combined contributions. As we hit our stride to finish the year, remember to run all the way through the finish line. Thanks for being a Good and Faithful Volunteer!



ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - JANUARY 12, 2023

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. December minutes were approved. MSP.

Treasurer's Report: Brotherhood Mutual is our new accounting service. Transition to the new accounting firm has gone smoothly. We do still have a local bookkeeper that we will use to pay local bills. Lane is looking in to getting a refund for payroll expenses spent during our Covid shut-down. We ended 2022 in the black. That's great news. The proposed budget for 2023 will include an increase, and will be available to the congregation after services for several Sundays prior to the annual meeting.

Council Roundtable:

Education: December was a busy month including the Christmas program and the Christmas store. Having a rehearsal with sound checks worked out great. Thanks to the sound team for making this happen. The Christmas store made just over \$1,000! The pancake breakfast was a big hit. Thank you, Don, for your help in organizing this. This will be held again on April 2nd.

Fellowship: Lane proposed an Uplifting Families Dinner. Details are being worked out. Tentatively scheduled for mid-March.

Preschool: We have a new committee member who is a preschool parent. A committee meeting will be held Tuesday, January 24.

Properties: We are working on adding a secondary door in the choir loft and taking care of plugs in the altar area. The furnace in the education wing is malfunctioning. It will be serviced this week.

WELCA: More volunteers would be nice. Nothing additional to add beyond the submitted report.

Personnel: Performance evaluations are completed. We collected names of suggested members that might need a pastoral visit.

Worship: Nothing new to report other than what was submitted. Lenten soup services details are being finalized.

Christmas Dinner: We had no leftovers. Over 340 meals were served. THANK YOU to all of our volunteers. The planning team wishes to purchase additional roasters. We will look into this at our next council mtg.

President's Report: John presented figures for budgeted expenses vs actual expenditures. We are right on track for the year. We also took a look at attendance numbers. Attendance is growing.

Pastor's Report: He suggested we read the book "Life Together" by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. This will be a book study for both council & staff. We received a monetary donation from someone who used our sanctuary to film a video. A person is wishing to donate a car for a person in need.

Special Guests/Reports: Pat Carrie Smith attended to represent the Live-Stream Team. We have a growing team of volunteers (including youth members) and it is working well.

Old Business:

- Anita reported on open items still needing action. Currently there are no open items.
- Photo Directory Status: Bayshore said they could print this for us. John is working on the layout. a printed copy will be available soon.

- Presentation of Candidates: We have council vacancies in Properties, Fellowship, Education, and Youth Ministries. Don will attach the list of open spots to the proposed budget made available to the congregation.

New Business:

- Facilities Usage Request: Young Life Beyond Malibu would like to use the church for training purposes. MSP
- Preschool Conference request: Maggie Santos would like to attend a preschool ELEA conference in SeaTac area in March. MSP to cover the cost of the conference and a hotel stay if needed.
- Preschool Mortgage Prepayment: The loan will come due in Nov 2024. We would like to pay off the loan.
 A proposal will be made at the annual meeting to retire the debt. The Preschool committee will meet and
 report back on how they would like to prioritize the spending of their reserve funds, including a portion
 that might go towards the debt retirement.

Our next council meeting will be held February 9 at 6:30 pm.

The meeting closed with prayer.

When I was in sixth grade, my teacher decided that we were going to build chicken skeletons. From real chickens. So, the teacher divided us into groups. A local farmer donated the chickens. Each group had to boil and boil their chicken. When all the flesh and tendons, etc. were boiled off, and the bones were clean, then we had to build the chicken back up so that it formed a complete bird.

When I think back on this project, I wonder what we were learning. Anatomy? Names of bones? I'm not sure. But what I did learn was community, relationship, and collaboration. Without the people in my group—and the different skills and gifts that they had — we would not have been able to put this chicken back together. We had to make sure that the bones were sorted into the right boxes (the feet bones, the leg bones, the wing bones, the beak, etc.) We had to make sure the bones weren't wet and that there wasn't anything left on the bones so it didn't stink. (My mom claimed it did stink. Side note, I was elected to bring home the completed chicken. My mom was not pleased and at some point, it disappeared from the living room bookcase).

Anyway, getting back to community, relationship, and collaboration...as I think of our synod, and what God is calling us to do and to be together, I think that these three things are key. I know that many of you are already in relationship and collaboration with other ELCA congregations around you. Perhaps you share your building with other ministries. Perhaps you share a food bank or work with a school. Perhaps affordable housing is part of your collaborative work. Many of you have preschools. All of these are wonderful ways to collaborate.

I'm wondering if we can think even bigger and more relationally than that. What if people from geographically close congregations met and talked about who they are. What their hopes are. What their fears are. What they need from others. What they have to offer others. What might come out of these conversations and relationships? Perhaps a way to share staff? Perhaps a way to more impactful in the community? Perhaps new ways of using property? I'm not sure. It would be interesting and exciting to find out.

As I have mentioned before, study after study indicates that pastors today are lonely and feel isolated and anxious about the future. As my staff and I travel around the synod, we hear that many congregations also feel lonely and isolated and anxious about the future. Hearing stories and knowing some of the difficulties, doesn't it seem that it would be better to build relationship with one another and collaborate rather than every congregation trying to figure it out on their own?

Here are three ways that we are encouraging congregations to be in community, build relationships & collaborate.

First, we continue to expand the LiVE Project (Living into Vocational Engagement). We are excited about the synod's collaboration and building relationship with the Trinity Education Foundation who is contributing funding this year and partnering with us. Second, in lieu of a Synod Assembly this year, we are hosting two Synod Gatherings in the spring with forums where relationships and collaboration are key. You know, I could never have built that chicken alone. Nor would I have wanted to. Truthfully, even with my group, it was messy and hard. In my memory, we had a few bones left over that we quietly threw in the garbage. And yet, I am still in relationship with many of the people in my sixth grade group. And we are bonded from the chicken-building experience.
