Dear Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,

As we enter November, I am reminded of how in many of the apostle Paul's letters he includes, "I give thanks for..." and then names a person or group that has walked alongside him in fulfilling the calling to ministry that Christ has given him. What is it like to live a life where 'thanksgiving' is not just something we celebrate as a holiday this month (or last month if you are in Canada), but rather as a lifestyle or practice that changes the way we see this world?

Diana Butler Bass has written a book titled "Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks" where she explores what changes in a person's life when they begin to approach situations in life through the lens of gratitude. Weaving in the social sciences, spirituality, and community engagement, she gives credence to how gratitude can strengthen our relationship with God, our neighbors, and even with ourselves. This is a follow-up book to "Grounded: Finding God in the World, A Spiritual Revolution" and takes the work and practice of gratitude to a place that feeds our very souls.

Gratitude, giving thanks, is an activity that becomes easier the more a person practices, just like anything else requiring practice. What would the change be in ourselves, and in our wider congregation and community, if we began an intentional practice of Giving Thanks this month? When we finally approach Thanksgiving, having had many days of practice, how might our experience of that holiday differ from how we have lived it in the past. Giving thanks for the gathering of family and friends – even when we don't see things the same way – reminds us that it is love that ultimately gathers us. Giving thanks for the wiggly youth during worship reminds us of the playfulness and energy that being in God's presence should raise up in us. Giving thanks for the rain that reminds us that winter is coming and that life continues even as the darkness lingers. Giving thanks for the bread and wine that reminds us that Jesus is with us.

Let us celebrate this month as we work toward living a life of gratitude!

# WELCOME TO FALL & THE ANNUAL STEWARDSHIP SEASON

Greeting and Blessings to our members and friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church.

#### **BLUF** (Bottom Line Up Front):

#### This is a Stewardship letter, so asking for money, time, and service will be a given.

Together we have been good Stewards of our house with God. We teamed up and painted the sanctuary, swapped out the ceiling fans, and revitalized our home with Jesus. We continue to have a strong and energetic youth program. We have come through a lot this year. Thank you for all you have given.

Through your generous contributions we have continued to meet our financial obligations while we have returned to in-person worship.

Working on this year's budget we are faced with a few challenges.

First and fore most considering the input from last year's budget vote meeting we are going to add a parttime Youth and Family Ministries position. This will add about \$25,000 to our bottom-line budget. This will ensure that we will continue to grow and nurture our youth activities.

Second, the cost of operating this next year will rise due to current inflation. In our budget we will need to plan for that. Salary increases along with the added cost to our usual operating expenses (heat, gas water insurance, safety inspections etc.) as well as our yearly required maintenance.

Finally, during our next year, our loan for the pre-school remodel will come due. With the current rise in interest rates, we would prefer to not have to re-finance this. We are looking for ways to pay off this debt for good.

To meet our next year's budget, I ask all of us to find it in our hearts and especially our budgets to increase our giving. We continue to have a growing and truly caring congregation. Let's continue to do the Lord's work together!

I think young families and new members are a good source of new enthusiasm and talent. We've recently seen several of our newer members take on important jobs around the church.
- <u>The Church Picture Directory:</u> We're going to give new members and others another chance to get into the directory before we print it, but we're very close. One session, no signup required, Sunday, October 23rd immediately after Church.
- We experienced an unfortunate illegal entry a couple of weeks ago and we're going to have to be more vigilant about closing and locking all doors and windows when we leave. The good news is that the entry was not vandalism, just petty theft, and we've recovered nearly all that was taken. But the Church will be locked during more hours of the day.

All in all, I see a very bright picture for Anacortes Lutheran this fall. We have several new faces worshipping with us. Make it a personal mission to make them welcome! I look forward to us being together for another wonderful season.

So my message this month is: Rejoice in each other's company! Find time right now to sing together, laugh together, and pray together. That year-end impact is coming up faster than you can imagine!

# JOSEPHINE'S GIVING PROJECT

Each year Josephine Caring Community, in conjunction with its partner churches, shared God's love by providing Christmas gifts to each one of our residents. This year we asked the residents what they would like most for Christmas. A majority of the residents asked for music. Such as carolers or instrumental music. With the covid-related restrictions, live music has been greatly missed these past couple of years. We know that is going to be a little trickier to sing with mask and social distancing, but our residents will still love it and greatly appreciate your musical offering.

Also, this year residents have asked for three consistent things over and over. They would like a new throw blanket, grippy socks (non-skid), and a neck pillow. We asked that these gifts be placed in a Christmas bag as a bundle, with the tag Josephine has provided, stating the residents name attached to it. These gifts are so meaningful and need to our residents.

Please identify or appoint a coordinator who can oversee the process of the gift giving for your congregation. Here is how it works:

- Your congregation will identify parishioners who are willing to provide a gift.
- Based on the number of people who volunteer, you will receive gift tags identifying the resident's first name and gift list. Your parishioners can then purchase these items.
- Due to dietary restrictions, we ask that you please do not include any supplemental food related items.
- Once the gifts are collected, they should be delivered to Josephine. We have a group of cheery staff who will help us distribute them on Christmas Eve.

# ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - OCTOBER 13, 2022

**Attendees**: John Parker, Lane Phelan, Jeanette Christensen, Jeaneen Brogan, Brian Hanrahan, Pastor Scott, Don Devine, Anne Barry, Anita Holzemer, Kendra Kennedy, Heather Harrington

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. September minutes were approved. MSP.

**Treasurer's Report**: We are on track after three quarters of giving. Benevolences have been paid. MSP to approve this quarter's benevolence recipients including Lutherwood, Friendship House, Salvation Army, Lutheran Disaster Relief, Josephine Sunset Home, El Camino de Emaus, and Young Life. We are depositing the preschool tuition payments. There was a request for two preschool scholarships. MSP to pay the scholarships with preschool legacy scholarship fund. Committee chairs have been given detailed spending reports, so they are aware of their current giving.

**Pastor's Report**: Attended the "Let's Go Together" meeting in Burlington. This will run for the next 5 Wednesdays. There is room for more participants from our church if you are interested. Met with Bishop Wee and other pastoral leaders for a Wee Walk.

**President's Report**: The end of the year is fast approaching. Lots to do before we get there including Stewardship and budgeting, next year's council leaders, and security issues here at the church. John will stay on another year and is looking for another good team. Upcoming council vacancies currently include Education, Youth, and Fellowship.

#### Old Business:

- 1. Anita reported on open items still needing action.
- 2. Wedding/Funeral Fees: Don will bring a hard copy for next month's meeting. Rachel will also email out a copy. We will revisit this next month.
- 3. Photo Directory Status: We will offer two more sessions of photo taking for those that want to be included in the directory. We are still waiting on a printing quote. Heather will help us get a quote from Bayshore.
- 4. Replacement for Accounting Firm: Lane did some research. Our current accountant is retiring. Ministry Works, a branch of Brotherhood Mutual, is affordable and could take over the payroll system. We would still need someone to do the bookkeeping portion. MSP to hire Ministry Works to provide payroll services for one year. MSP to hire ABS for one year to handle our bookkeeping.
- 5. Drive for a Fellowship Chairperson: Still no luck. Jeaneen talked to Kathy Khile about past Fellowship events. Jeaneen suggested we divide the job up. It was suggested council sponsor a potluck meal every other month or so. People have ideas. Maybe interested people can host various events as it interests them.

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Church illegal entry: Bill will pursue motion sensor lights and cameras as a preventative measure once he returns from vacation.
- 2. Attendance: Currently we are averaging a weekly attendance of 100. What can we do to increase attendance? It was suggested we track online numbers. **ACTION ITEM**: Kendra will work with Pat Carrie Smith to start keeping online attendance data.
- 3. Water Heater(s) replacement: The water heaters near the Fellowship Hall and in the basement have failed and will need replacing. We will downsize to one water heater in the Fellowship Hall but we will need a quote from a commercial plumber.

- 4. Stewardship/Budget Plan: Don is working on the 2023 budget. He is suggesting a \$595,000 budget for next year. This includes \$20,000 for a part time Youth & Family person and a COLA for staff. Don will do a temple talk on Oct 30. A proposed budget will be presented at next month's council meeting. ACTION ITEM: Committee chair-people need to submit input to Don on spending wants/needs. Get your numbers in to Don by the end of October.
- 5. Potential for Covid "lost salary" reimbursement: Lane will work with Ministry Works to seek their help in recouping funds lost during the COVID shutdown. There is a potential to recoup funds based on the pre school closure and employee cutbacks through the CARES Act.
- 6. Musicians Jam Session: Kenny Holzemer and John Parker will start a music session beginning on Thursday 10/27 at 7:00 PM. If it works, we may expand to the general community.
- 7. Preschool job descriptions: Anne worked hard at bringing the job descriptions into line with the church guidelines. She met with Maggie to work out the details. There will no longer be a preschool "board". It will now by a preschool "committee" and will meet with the Pastor, treasurer, and an ALC parent/ guardian of a current student. They will meet semi-annually at minimum but may meet more frequently. MSP to accept proposed changes. ACTION ITEM: Anne will send the documents electronically to Anita for editing. Anita will edit and send out to council before the next meeting for approval. Preschool would like to order a privacy screen for the playground. ACTION ITEM: Maggie or Anne will send privacy screen information to the Properties committee for research/purchase.

#### Council Roundtable:

- Reformation plans are underway. New members will be joining soon.
- Thanksgiving Eve services will not happen but suggested a pie potluck be held after Sunday service before Thanksgiving.
- Preliminary plans are underway for Christmas Dinner. Details to be finalized.

# FROM BISHOP Shelly Wee - The Spirit November 2022

I just spoke with one of my friends who attended seminary with me. She is a pastor in the Midwest. And she is a great pastor. She is warm. She is funny. She loves Jesus. She loves the Church. She loves Church so much that she used to attend three different Lutheran churches in a weekend (not counting the church she serves). She feels called by God to be a pastor. But today I had a phone call from her. She was crying. And she said to me (as a friend – not as a bishop), "The thing is I don't get that much enjoyment out of pastoring for the work involved except God probably wants me to do it. Knowing that is some consolation."

Recently I heard Pastor Dan White speak about pastor burn-out on a podcast:

"I mean, I'm seeing pastors every week who would never have considered rethinking their call as a pastor, who are doing that every week. And it's just because things are so broken and hurting and exhausting, and they're faced with that question now. And they never had to face it before. So I think it's just kind of flipping over the apple cart, and everything is kind of being questioned." *The New York Times Podcast First Person, July 21, 2022* 

According to Barna Group\*, two out of five pastors have thought about leaving ministry in the last year. This is remarkably higher from previous years. What is the difference? According to Barna, the top reasons include stress, loneliness, and political division. While these three reasons are not new, we know that Covid compounded some of the tensions that already existed. We know that the last two and half years have frayed relationships in ways we did not expect. As Bishop, I know that pastors are leaving congregations at a faster pace than I have ever experienced and the three reasons above are often the reason.

Oof! This makes me sad and anxious. This isn't how pastoring is supposed to be. As I tell people in premarital counseling, "Sometimes life is hard. Sometimes a relationship is hard. But neither life nor marriage should be hard all the time. Most of the time your relationship should make life better." And the same holds true for being a pastor. Sometimes pastoring is hard. But it shouldn't be hard all the time.

So how can we help pastors, and other leaders, who are experiencing stress, loneliness, and political division in the congregation?

If we continue to look at Barna research, it appears that pastors who continue to feel called to ministry responded that even though they might be experiencing stress, loneliness, and political division, they also have support through family, community, and other strong relationships.

How can this happen? How can we build mutually caring and loving relationships with one another? How can we rebuild what Covid frayed? How do we best support and encourage our pastors, deacons, and lay ministry professionals? How can we, together, be the body of Christ for one another?
