Dear Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,



ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - MAY 12, 2022

Attendees: John Parker, Lane Phelan, Anita Holzemer, Pastor Scott, Anne Barry, Dave Bjornsen, Jeanette Christensen, Don Devine, Brian Hanrahan, Bill LeDuc, Guest: Laurie Julius-Carver

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. April minutes were approved. MSP.

Treasurer's Report: April was a good month. Easter offering was encouraging. With the designated Easter offering we sent \$1,300 to the Anacortes Family Center and \$1,375 to Ukraine war relief. We are looking very good for the year so far.

Pastor's Report: Taking online continuing education on homiletics (sermon writing). Zoom has made for good collaboration time.

President's Report: Very happy and encouraged by the direction we are headed. Attendance is trending up as well as offering. Kathy Khile is working on directory pictures. Online registration is going well.

Special Guests/Reports:

Laurie Carver made a presentation on ALC's Copyright requirements and procedures.

Old Business:

- 1. Book Study: We discussed Chapter Two of the Book "Growing Young", the process of attracting and keeping young people in the Church. Persephone Pestar has accepted the role of a youth council member. The goal is to recruit one more to share the duties.
- 2. "Noisy Offerings" have been a big success, (\$194 last week!). They will be totaled and deposited once a month, in a fund designated for youth activities, not otherwise budgeted.
- 3. Online sign up for the directory is proceeding well. The first of eight photo sessions was held on Wed, May 8. The objective is to publish a picture directory in September. Kathy Khile is heading this project up.
- 4. Drafts of job descriptions for all staff positions are complete. The goal is to have them completed by June 1.
- 5. There is an opening on the Preschool Board. Preschool is focusing mainly on registration for the fall right now. Once graduation is done, we will work on reactivating the preschool board.
- 6. We are still looking for a Fellowship Chairperson. Chuck and Bev Landgraf have volunteered to organize the summer picnics. Boyd Veer has volunteered to host the MELCA Bratfest. Jeanette Christensen has volunteered to do the Senior Graduation reception. Thanks to all of our wonderful volunteers stepping up on the individual fellowship events, but we would still love to have a chairperson to head up the committee.

New Business:

- Review of facilities use ground rules/responsibilities: John met with the Young Life group that recently stayed over the weekend at the church. He was impressed. Are there guidelines for the kitchen use? A discussion was held on key distribution. ACTION ITEM: Properties Committee will research facility use guidelines.
- We will create an "Action Items Tracking List" to keep track of designated projects at the church. This will include the date we added the item, the goal, progress, and who is the point person for it. We will revisit it each month.

<u>Council Roundtable</u>: A full committee report is available in the church office with the minutes each month. Below are items from committees that need full council input.

Worship Committee:

- Concerns were raised that some people can't hear the choir. Mask wearing might play into this. We
 would love to recruit new members which would help with the sound as well. A suggestion was made to
 put the lyrics on the screen or in the bulletin. Maybe amplification via the soundboard. Dave will take
 these ideas back to the worship committee. Microphone placement can be repositioned if needed when
 the lift is brought in during the painting time.
- Confirmation is scheduled for June 5th on Pentecost Sunday. The Education Committee is in charge of the reception. Senior Sunday is June 12th.
- We will move to 9:30 worship time over Memorial Day weekend.

Properties:

FROM THE BISHOP - The Spirit JUNE 2022

Today I walked my dogs. As I was walking, one person told me how beautiful my dogs were. (I agree!) Another person told me they were so glad to see the sun. (Me too!) Another mock-yelled after me when I didn't greet him, "Hey! Aren't you going to say hello?" (I smiled and waved.) I love my neighborhood in South Everett. I especially love that there are several languages being spoken in the homes surrounding mine: there is a multitude of ethnicities, there are different religious expressions, children's voices are heard at all hours of the day, and there are different food smells wafting out windows at dinner time.

Even as I experience belonging and love for this neighborhood, though, I am also aware of the troubles and heartaches here. A little girl was hit by a car and died here a few years ago. People have been affected by COVID. Rising prices are causing some to not be able to live here. People who are renting are being forced out when landlords decide to sell. And there are people affected by meth, domestic violence, and so much more behind the walls of the homes in my neighborhood.

I think of all of us in the "neighborhood" of the Northwest Washington Synod and how I love our neighborhood. I love the diversity we have in our synod. I love the different geographies, landscapes, languages, ethnicities, cultures, and foods in our synod. As I journey through the 110+ congregations and ministry sites of this synod, I am aware of the deep joys and crushing sorrows, and the connections and the loneliness that surround us. Much like my little neighborhood, there is diversity and there is belonging here. And much like my little neighborhood, there is loss and there is grief and there is difficulty. We cannot ignore that there are thorny and deep-seated social and relational complexities within us as a church and in society as a whole.

Holding the "both/and" of this reality – the true joy and the deep sorrow and frustration – is why the theme for this year's 2022 Synod Assembly is abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Now let me say this: While it is true that some may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and assume that we are naively optimistic or positive. Others may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and think that we do not understand the mountain that we must climb. Still others may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and wonder how – with the pain Church has caused many or the sins of our ancestors – that we are only living in the present and not acknowledging the past. To those, this is what I say:

We are abounding in hope. And because we are abounding in hope we are invited into complex and difficult conversations through the power of the Holy Spirit. We are able to face the realities of life today - knowing that we are not alone. We do not ignore or downplay or pretend that there are not sad and horrifying realities in our world today. We fiercely hold on to the hope that comes only through Jesus. And, knowing this, together, we are called to be, share in, and live into the good news that comes through our risen Savior Jesus. And so ... we are **abounding in hope.**

I am thankful to be living in this neighborhood of Northwest Washington Synod with you. May we abound in hope through God's Spirit living in this world and into God's future.
