Is there anything like a Black Market Barber?

I asked that question, only somewhat in jest. I have calculated by the time social distancing guidelines are lifted I'm going to look like someone who recently escaped from the '60's. My hair continues to grow and I'm looking a little scruffier each passing day.

When I put that question to some family members and friends I was told a stylist or barber who violates the current guidelines would be in jeopardy of losing their license. I concluded it was best to allow my locks to flourish and just wait this thing out.

But it occurs to me, if my biggest concern is the appearance of my hair, then I am indeed one of the fortunate ones in this pandemic. While I frown at the image staring back at me in the mirror and bemoan this inconvenience, others are struggling for their lives in ICU units around the nation while many on the global level don't even have access to lifesaving medical attention. Doctors, Nurses, EMT's and others are putting their very lives at risk as they deal with the staggering numbers of those in need of emergency care amidst dwindling resources. Others are grieving for love ones while being unable to adequately mourn at funeral services. Many small businesses are at the brink or over the edge, while families wonder if they will still have a job or housing or food. Statistics show domestic abuse is on the rise.

We all know things are bad for millions. My inconvenience doesn't begin to approach the level of loss and pain many are experiencing.

This pandemic has kept me from personally meeting many of you. I've tried to remedy that with phone calls and Zoom meetings, encounters I've truly enjoyed, but it's just not the same as greeting someone in person or sitting across from them during a home visit. We on the church staff and in congregational leadership are aware some of you are enduring a great share of suffering from which others have been mostly spared. In our prayers we ask for wisdom and for God to come to you with healing, strength and hope.

Christians struggle with the question, "How can we be the church at a time like this?" Obviously worship and pastoral care are taking on new forms. Yet it's important to remember you are the church. So pray for our country and our world. Pray for those in government who make difficult decisions when all options have crushing downsides. Pray for those at risk who provide medical care and other essential services. And look out for your family and neighbors. If you know of someone in the congregation who is in special need, let us know. Continue to make those phone calls to others, just to bolster them with a familiar voice. Thank God for loving hearts.

I hope to see you soon on the other side of this crisis. My hair might be a bit too long, but I can live with that. To the best of our ability let's be God's presence for those who need so much more.

Matthew 18:20 assures us of God's presence with us when and wherever we gather, which we now can see includes 'virtual' gathering. Hearing familiar voices, seeing familiar faces, and knowing our ALC family members are with us has given us all a comforting sense of connection in this time of separation.

We received the photo below which shows how one of our members has created a special sacred space for worship. This attention to the creation of a kind of sanctuary outside the church building demonstrates the power and presence of the Spirit of the risen Christ who gathers us together, who is present in our midst, who connects us with one another in unity through the power of the Holy Spirit.

It may have been a month since we have been together in our beautiful sanctuary, but we have been, and will continue to be together in prayer, in worship, and in companionship, whether by mail or phone or email or website or Facebook or YouTube. With the support of our church family and the abiding presence of our God, we will get through this time of trouble and find the bond of love for God and neighbor has grown stronger.

May the grace of our Savior Jesus Christ and the love of God and the friendship of the Holy Spirit be with you all, now and always.

Needed weekly to meet our 2020 budget \$7,400.

ALC COUNCIL MINUTES - April 16, 2020

Attended -Via Zoom: Bill LeDuc, Lane Phelan, Pastor Deborah Butler, Pastor Walt Rice, Melanie Sahnow, Maggie Santos, Kendra Kennedy, Dave Bjornson, Jeaneen Brogan, Kathy Khile & Les Olson.

Bill opened the meeting at 6:30pm and Pastor Walt shared a prayer.

Presidents Report:

Pastors Report: The taped worship services went well. Thank you everyone for your time and energy putting them together. Thank you, Becky for the outstanding job filming and editing so we could share them. Pastor Walt has been able to connect with many via phone or zoom and is looking forward to a meet and greet with everyone. Pastor Deborah reports that as of today we have no Covid-19 cases in Island Hospital. Happy Birthday to Paul Knowles he is 104.

Treasurers Report: Lane gave report. We had a \$10k gift so total giving was \$28,970 at the end of 11 weeks. That makes giving average \$6824 a week and budget is \$7400. Easter giving was \$2,975 with more coming in. We are hoping that all furloughed employees are now getting unemployment.

Old Business: The Transition Team has had meetings and in need of two people interested in joining the team. They are looking at doing a survey to gather information.

New Business: Looking at how the church will look when we open back up after Covid-19. Social distancing, masks, hand sanitizer, maybe an extra service? Maybe services live streamed to the fellowship hall to spread out. Then there is meetings, everyone responsible to sanitize after. Lots to think about. Worship and Property committees will look at this.

Personnel Report: Jeaneen reports for Steve that we are happy that Rachel is back. Dave and Mirth are on furlough and still waiting to get unemployment. Becky has put in 50-60 volunteer hours and can we compensate her? Steve will look at.

WELCA Report: Jeaneen says they are anxious to get preparations going for the Strawberry Social in June.

Outreach: No Report

Property Report: Les will gather questions from the committee's and have a meeting via Zoom with them on April 24th to address getting the church back open and he will purchase more cleaning supplies. The floor is done in the fellowship hall. Frank & Colleen are still working making sure everything is clean and sterilized. We have a new carpet cleaner/floor scrubber. Asking Legacy to reimburse \$500 for new lights in Pastor's office and the financial secretary's office. They had no April mtg. We received a letter from the NW Ortho that they will no longer pay to rent the parking lot. It was discussed that we wait a little while before putting up signs and a fence across the property line on the alley side.

Education: Kendra met with her committee via Zoom. All Easter events and VBS have been cancelled. Planning something for July in place of VBS but will wait and see. They will hold the packets purchased for VBS to use next year. Sunday school and youth attendance were low before, how to get numbers up?

Fellowship Report: Kathy is working on the FAST teams and looking for volunteers for May so we can be ready for services to start back. No plans for summer picnic's right now.

Youth Report: No report.

Preschool Report: Maggie reports that they sent out notices that school is closed for the rest of the year. She has reimbursed ½ of tuition paid for March as well as the few that paid for whole year. Also, she has a few checks to return paying tuition for next year. She also was able to pay payroll. Waiting to see who can get unemployment. Paid time off, can that be part of their pay?

Stewardship Report: No report

Worship Report: The recorded Good Friday & Easter service went great, we all really enjoyed being able to watch at our convenience, thank you.

From the Bishop · The Spirit May 2020



Last night I had a dream. It was a strange dream. I dreamed that an older man was crying because his wife had died. Out of concern and love, I hugged him. And then I stepped back appalled that I had touched him. And then suddenly I was in a text study group with

several other pastors (you know how dreams go...) and they were angry with me for touching this man and getting too close to them ... and then I woke up. And, as is often the case, it was 3 AM and I lay in bed thinking about this strange world we are in where hugging is a nightmare and waking up and finding oneself alone is a relief.

First, let me say to you all, I hope you are doing ok. And if you are not, please reach out to your pastor, your deacon, your family, your friends, your congregation, this synod. We are Church Together — even, especially, in this time. Please know that even as we continue physical distancing, we are still in community. We are still Holy Community. We are still the Body of Christ in this world.

One way that the synod would like to demonstrate how we are Church Together is offering some relief to congregations for salaries. With this in mind, the synod has begun the **NWWA Synod COVID-19**Relief Fund for congregations and ministry sites.

The monies for this fund come from an anonymous supporter with matching funds from the synod. At the moment, we have approximately \$41,000 in this account. Our hope is that this fund will work in two ways:

 To distribute funds to those who need financial help towards salaries (particularly our most vulnerable ministries.) 2. Provide opportunity for those who are seeking a way to support others (financially stable congregations and individuals could make a donation to this fund to help support others who are in need).
