

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR WALT

I'm amused by some of those strange laws which are still on the books throughout America. Here are some federal laws I bet you didn't know.

You are not allowed to sell runny ketchup. And in case you didn't know it, there are also only three ways you are allowed to spell the name of that thick red sauce: Ketchup, Catsup and Catchup (I've never seen that one before). So I guess you better have your spell checker working so you don't break any laws.

There's a federal code which doesn't allow you to sell noodles which are too thick or too thin.

15 U.S.C. § 330a prohibits you from using lasers in order to make it rain. Violators could be slapped with a \$10,000 fine.

In Rhode Island you can't bite off another person's arm.

Nearby in Everett you are not allowed to hypnotize someone unless you are indoors.

My favorite has always been this one which is on the books in Denver: it is illegal to open a can of beans with a shotgun.

However, the one law which caught my attention in my most recent internet search was this one: In Texas you cannot hold public office if you don't believe in a Supreme Being.

Now, I'm all for people who are inspired to do good deeds or perform public service because they are motivated by their belief system. I also favor having faith, especially so because I'm in the faith business. But is it really a good idea to mandate belief? In fact, can you regulate someone into faith?

Obviously, such legislation has been tried throughout history. There have been times when people of the wrong Christian persuasion have been burned at the stake. Some governments have mandated a state religion. However, is that really the best way for Christians to spread the Gospel?

It seems faith by fiat, by command, is really a lazy way to do evangelism and I doubt it is that effective. Jesus sent out his followers to "make disciples of all nations," but doing so by legal imposition doesn't seem to be our Lord's *modus operandi*. And that certainly isn't what the Twelve were doing. They spoke of what they had witnessed with their eyes and about what God was doing in the lives of people. Some were persuaded and became baptized followers of Jesus. Others were not convinced and chose not to follow. But a common thread throughout the Book of Acts was the work of the Spirit in the

transformation of people's hearts. The Apostles simply proclaimed the Word while the Spirit created faith.

Reflect on what brought you to faith. It probably wasn't because someone commanded you to believe, but because you sat on your grandmother's knee when she told you Bible stories or because your family worshipped together or because a compassionate Christian neighbor walked with you in your journey during dark times. Faith comes from hearing and from the work of God the Spirit.

We are called to bear witness, to pronounce the gospel and then to entrust the other into the care of the Holy Spirit. There is no law which is going bring about true transformation.

You can regulate how to open a can of beans in Denver, but true faith is still an amazing miracle. We are called. We speak. And God takes it from there.



ALC COUNCIL MINUTES SUMMARY - MAY 13, 2021

Attended: Bill LeDuc, Lane Phelan, Pastor Walt Rice, Dave Bjornson, Jeaneen Brogan, Jeanette Christensen, Kendra Kennedy, Les Olsen, John Parker, & Peggy White.

- Meeting opened 6:30 pm with Bill leading The Lord's Prayer.
- Minutes of April 22nd meeting M/S/P.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

- Balance Sheet was given and discussion was had regarding Assets. Giving is steady and good.
- Net income after first quarter of \$36,901. Annual gifts would decrease it by \$20,000.
- \$7,000 was paid in first quarter Benevolence dollars.
- \$8,658.75 has been given as memorials for Pastor Benson Scholarship Fund.
- Still have the \$25,000 given as preschool scholarships remaining in our checking account.
- Six high school graduates have applied for scholarships.
- \$20,000 left in savings from a special gift. Suggestions: pay down "remodel loan", Earmark for Maintenance, Earmark some for Technical software & hardware upgrades. Discussion was had regarding Heritage Bank assets, and whether we should have it go toward Maintenance and our new Pastor. We have \$54,000 in the Heritage account. A motion was made by Bill, regarding moving the \$20,000 to the Heritage Savings. M/S/P.

PASTOR WALT'S REPORT:

• Andy Yee will be giving a recount next Tuesday regarding interviews. Walt will not be involved with the deciding (just the advising) until it is presented to the church congregation. Everyone needs to be aware of the new CDC update, i.e. masks, etc.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

 Bill states the call committee is moving forward. The Call Committee progress should have the names by May 18th.

NEW BUSINESS:

• John Parker was appointed as Stewardship Chairman for remainder of the year. M/S/P.

STEWARDSHIP:

- John Parker states that "Stewardship implies that you're the caretaker". In our case, it's the stewardship of the Christian belief. John's emphasis will be to nominate people to look into the concept of the "Church Family". John is looking forward to it and will work with Lane on this.

BISHOPS MESSAGE - The Spirit June 2021 + Bishop Shelley Bryan Wee

I began my Bishop's Report for the 2021 Synod Assembly on May 15, 2021 by quoting Paul in his letter to the Romans, "I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world."

I am so glad to be the Northwest Washington Synod with you – as we walk, journey, travel together. We are connected as the body of Christ – as siblings in Christ – together. We are the Northwest Washington Synod in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Together in Jesus Christ we are freed by grace to live faithfully, witness boldly, and serve joyfully. As people forgiven and redeemed, beloved and welcomed, we are called to embody God's grace in speech, action, and relationships. I am reminded daily that it is Jesus Christ who loves, welcomes, and forgives. As baptized children of God, we are called to participate in this love, hospitality, and forgiveness. I am thankful for all of you for your love, your welcome, and your forgiveness.

We on the synod staff have agreed to embrace the following statement as we work together with the congregations and ministry sites of this synod: "Trusting in the Spirit, we are journeying together with God's people so that all may discover and participate in what God is doing among us through Jesus."

Further, there are five focus areas interwoven in the work that we are doing as we journey together in Christ:

- I. Faithful Innovation
- 2. Youth and Young Adults
- 3. Leadership
- 4. Connection
- 5. Racial Justice

I'd like to lift up a few of the actions from the 2021 NW WA Synod Assembly:

- We had our first online assembly with 332 voting members in attendance on Zoom and over 200 following along on our Facebook Livestream.
- We approved the Recommended Changes to the Constitution that were forwarded from the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.
- We approved the changes to the Constitution proposed by the Synod Council (with a minor amendment to have the Nominating Committee changed to 5 persons).
- We elected persons to the following: Synod Council Committee on Discipline Consultation Committee Voting Members to the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly
- Approved budget.
- We shared videos from our ministry partners and synod committees/teams.
- Announced Grace Grants recipients.

As we do the work of this synod, I am reminded that it is not us but the Spirit that leads and guides. Trusting God's promises and participating in the Holy Spirit, we have reached places beyond what I thought possible. We have exceeded priorities and we are moving forward towards God's preferred future. I am grateful to be on this journey with you.
