

Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,

I was speaking with someone the other day about what a Lutheran is. They were a person that did not grow up in a church environment and so were wondering what all the differences were that made so many different churches. I told them that to go through all the differences would take a couple of weeks to run through, but then I told them that all of them were Christian churches. They were confused about this because why would there be so many if they were all Christian churches. I gave the illustration that churches, like ice cream, has a lot of flavors (around 40,000 registered denominations in the US today), but that they all had the simple ingredients that made them a Christian church. "So it is all about the different flavors," they asked. Yes, it is about how we are flavored differently to reach the widest range of people with the message of God's love.

When I returned home later that day, I thought of this quote of Martin Luther:

The first thing I ask is that people should not make use of my name, and should not call themselves Lutherans but Christians. What is Luther? The teaching is not mine. Nor was I crucified for anyone...How did I, poor stinking bag of maggots that I am, come to the point where people call the children of Christ by my evil name?

It seems we do get caught up by those many things that differentiate us from one another and forget about all those things that we hold in common. Earlier today, a few of the other religious leaders in Anacortes gathered for a time of shared discussion and prayer and our conversation again returned to this idea of denominational differences not being nearly as important as how we see ourselves (and our churches) as gathered by Jesus and to share His story. It is Jesus who gathers us together and calls us friends.

When I start to dwell on how much of society seeks to create division, I remember that we are called by Jesus to live for God and for our neighbor. We are called to love our 'enemy' and not just those who think like we do. We are to live lives of reaching out to the "least of these" and to help however we can. We are to live out our Christian faith by being Christlike.

Yes, there will still be differences in thought and opinions. We may not agree as to the best way to go about providing the basics of life to everyone. We will not agree on which car to drive or what boat to float, but we can agree that God loves us and that we are called to love one another. If we can do this, it will be enough.

The meeting was called to order and Pastor opened with prayer. August minutes were approved as submitted.

**Treasurer's Report:** A written report was submitted. Attendance and offerings were lower this summer, September attendance and offerings thus far have been better. Linda Millo, John Parker and Lane will continue to work with the finance program and plan to have an up-to-date report for January-September at the end of September.

WELCA: A written report was submitted.

**Property:** A written report was submitted to council and to the newsletter. There is a new lock on the front door, matching other door locks in the building. Two furnaces have been inspected and signed off by the city of Anacortes. Old blackened vent filters have been removed. Lightbulbs in ovens and refrigerators have been replaced. The refrigerator/freezer in the youth area needs cleaning out and defrosting, Michael will look into this. Steve suggests 30 minutes of weeding by the youth or Boy Scouts as a thank you for building use. Don gave appreciation for Steve's work.

Outreach: No report.

**Youth:** Michael and Jobun met regarding youth activities. They are looking at a Lutherwood fall retreat in place of the summer retreat. The 3 mini-VBS days went well. They have the VBS package to do a full VBS week again next summer. The elementary-young middle school attendance is strong as there is a core group of kids attending. The older middle school-high school youth attendance has been more challenging. The Flamingo fundraiser went well. Plans are being worked on for the Trunk or Treat event and a family pool and BBQ event.

**Pastor's Report:** A written report was submitted. Reminder from Amanda to turn in any news of October events by 9/23 to get into the newsletter. Pastor has curriculum for a First Communion Class. Jeaneen, Jeanette and Lane will review the existing membership roll to update them. Pastor has had calls as the chaplain in the community during emergencies.

**Preschool:** A written report was submitted. School started Monday, the classes are not quite full. Let Anne know if anyone else needs CPR training as they will be setting that up for the preschool employees.

**Personnel:** All positions are filled in the preschool and nursery. There are 17 employees in the church and 7 in preschool.

**Worship:** A written report was submitted. There is Boy Scout popcorn stored in the Altar Guild storage area. Don will reach out Chris Anderson (Boy Scout lead) to see what storage is needed and suggest another place to store these.

**Stewardship:** Bill requests committee budget recommendations for next year - please have this in by October 1 so he can start working on a 2025 budget. If there are no changes from last year, let him know this. Regarding the Parking Lot Fund, there is currently \$13,000 with another \$7,000 promised, more money is needed. The cracks have weeds growing in them - Bill is trying to keep that under control until we have new pavement.

#### **New Business:**

- Education begins 10/6 with an intergenerational class. Adult, Confirmation and Sunday School classes begin 10/13.
- The Ministry Fair on 9/22 is being organized by the Worship Committee. Any committees who want to advertise what they do can have a table and a sign for coffee hour that day. Don will make an announcement on Sunday, 9/15.
- Youth Breakfast will be on Sunday 9/29. Michael and Don will create the menu.
- The kitchen refrigerator coils are rusted (24 years old). Anne made a motion to replace the refrigerator before it breaks, all were in favor. Don will find 3 to consider at the next council meeting.
- Warner Berglund has been mowing for many years and is retiring from this volunteer ministry. Don will send him a thank
  you letter after Pat-Carrie finds out how long he has been doing this. Bill LeDuc will take this mowing ministry over
  (Dorothy already is keeping up on the flower beds etc). Dorothy is willing to work with any volunteers to replant the bed
  where the sign is on the parking lot corner (the city cleared the hedge for a wheelchair accessible sidewalk). Don will
  reach out to Chris Anderson to see if there is an Eagle Scout who needs a project. Thrivent could give \$250 towards the
  project.

#### Council minutes continued...

- Lane led a discussion on bringing back a paper mailing of the newsletter. In addition, Michael noted other churches have flyers distributed in the community. These would be reminders that ALC is here and continues to care for members who no longer come as well as for people in the community.
- Pastor reports that the Prayer Wall will launch in October, plans are under way.
- The Constitution revisions were introduced. Bill made a motion to hold a separate meeting on Tuesday, 9/17 at 5:30pm for council to discuss in further detail. All were in favor.

Jeanette moved to adjourn the meeting.

Our next regular council meeting will be held October 10 at 6:30 pm. Please have committee reports in to Julie no later than midnight on Tuesday, October 8.

#### From the Bishop:



It sometimes comes as a surprise to people, but the Northwest Washington Synod is a companion synod with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in European Russia (ELCER). For several years many of our congregations — at one time almost twenty — were connected to Lutheran congregations in Russia to share ideas, fund certain projects, learn about one another, and, most importantly, build relationships with our Lutheran siblings in Russia. Unfortunately, many of these relationships have faltered or broken down in the last few years. However, recently I was fortunate to meet up with some of our Russian Lutheran siblings and I am excited about new possibilities and new relationships.

Before I tell you about my recent trip, let me first give you some history about the Lutheran Church in Russia. Since the Protestant Reformation, there has been a Lutheran Church in Russia. While we often think that Russia only has Orthodox churches, it is interesting to note that Lutherans have persevered and endured for over 500 years in Russia – through different czars, wars, persecution as a minority church, the Soviet Union, and more - dedicated to sharing the good news of Jesus with all.

Today there are three Russian Lutheran Synods who have ELCA companion synods: The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria in Russia (ELCIR) – companion synod Northeastern Minnesota, the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of the Urals, Siberia, and the Far East (ELCUSFE) – companion synod Central States, and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in European Russia (ELCER) – companion synod Northwest Washington.

Our companion synod, ELCER, is located primarily in St. Petersburg and Moscow along with other areas around these cities. In the recent history of ELCER, Bishop and Archbishop Dietrich Brauer had to move with his family from Russia to Germany for safety after speaking against the war when Russia invaded Ukraine. Following this, the ELCER then elected a new bishop. He sadly died a few months after taking office. The ELCER then elected another new bishop and archbishop in 2023. The new bishop is Bishop Sergei Holzwert and the Archbishop is Vladimir Provorov.

Because we in the ELCA are dedicated to renewing our relationship with our Russian Lutheran siblings, and because we are unable to travel to each other's country right now due to the war in Ukraine, it was arranged that representatives from ELCA Churchwide, the three Russian synods, and the three ELCA synods would meet in a neutral country. We were blessed to have twenty of us together from the ELCA and the Russian synods gather in September 2024 to build relationships, share ideas, and worship together in Novi Sad, Serbia. It was such a blessing to be in Novi Sad with Pastor Hector Garfias-Toledo and Ms. Mary Muller representing the NWWA Synod and to be with Bishop Sergei Holzwert, Archbishop Vladimir Provorov, and Pastor Ivan Shirokov representing the ELCER.

We learned from our brothers that it has been difficult these last few years. The isolation they feel from the rest of the world in hard. They also have political division in their congregations as well as a shortage of pastors. It has also been a meaningful and joyful time. They were excited to share that many people have joined the church during these difficult years. As we shared our hopes and dreams we together talked about how to have more youth involved, how to do more lay ministry, and what are some educational opportunities. It was a full and rich conversation as we each shared and listened to one another.

After learning and discussing, and after beginning to rebuild relationships, we ended our time committing ourselves to these next steps:

- Establishing/renewing our covenant with one another
- Establishing a communication committee that will meet regularly with one another
- Have both parties feel that they are part of the universal church'
- Share experiences in social programs
- Have a gathering of youth from both synods perhaps meet in Georgia (the country)
- Collaborate on lay ministry and what lay ministry looks like in both sites
- Have a Zoom in the next two months to continue to build relationships
- Have youth involvement in all of these things




