



A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SCOTT

Anacortes Lutheran Church - March 2023 Newsletter

Is there something different you do during the season of Lent to set it apart. Historically Lent was a season for the catechumenate to prepare for their baptism during the Easter Vigil gathering. It was a season of study, prayer, spiritual discipline, fasting, and other practices that deepened faith and faith community participation. As the practice of infant baptism became the norm, the season of Lent changed a bit. Probably the most familiar part of Lent is the act of “giving something up” and then like New Year’s Resolutions see how long we can keep it going. It is in some way a sense of ‘fasting’. Some people I have known have given up things like: Brussels sprouts, liver and onions, or even limburger cheese (I don’t know how they made it!) Some have given up things that may be a little more difficult, like: chocolate, dessert, candy, cursing, or even hamburgers. I have prided myself on giving up giving things up, but then I realized that I failed in that one from the very beginning.

Isaiah 58:6 reads, “Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?” (NRSV) What if we spent time in Lent to work toward justice. Of course, we may have differing opinion of what that exactly means, but I do think we can agree that justice is a good thing. We work to help one another be the best we can be, to dismantle obstructions that may hinder, and to remember that we all are better off when each of us has enough. When we put our effort toward those endeavors that we are gifted for and passionate about, we create energy that is then freed for creative purposes. Life as a community in this way almost creates something like a perpetual motion machine as the community is strengthened by the energy that comes from us working together in the same direction.

Like the Isaiah text mentions, sometimes it is in “loosing” that we find the freedom to really stretch into a new reality. We “undo the thongs” that hold us back and we move forward with the love of God filling us that we may overflow that love into the world. And we move forward with each person living who they are in the midst of the community, we celebrate difference and realize that it spices up our life together. Like a patchwork quilt, all the pieces come together so that it may wrap around in an embrace of love from those who created it.

May this Lent be a time not of burden, but one of renewal in our lives of faith and our relationships with God and with one another.

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. January minutes were approved. MSP.

Treasurer's Report: Our new accountant is still getting acquainted with our systems. Lane will remind the congregation about donating to LWR for the earthquake disaster. A bulletin insert will be included this Sunday with information on how to help relief efforts. Our heating bill has gone way up due to an increase in rates and usage. If you have a meeting in the church, perhaps come prepared with a sweater rather than turning up the furnace as a way to save on our energy bill. A motion will be proposed at the annual meeting to pay off the preschool mortgage.

Council Roundtable:

Outreach: Dave is interested in pursuing the synod grants. His committee is working on visitations, rides, and re-establishing the Care Teams.

Personnel: Steve Anderson has volunteered to work with LiveStream. Anita is learning to make slides. Kenny has been working with the sound system. Laurie will continue to head up the sound team for now.

Preschool: Report was submitted. We are meeting tomorrow to formally approve the tuition increase.

Properties: Details are in Bill's report. His committee is looking at fixing the chair lift. MSP to fix the existing fire alarm system. This will give the update we need to work with the 5G and Bluetooth system. Motion activated lights have been installed in the sanctuary. **ACTION ITEM:** Jeaneen will ask our janitorial crew to do a walk around and check windows for security purposes. Just as a reminder, if you open a window or door, please close and secure behind you.

Stewardship: Don will present the budget at the meeting this Sunday. Don is looking for volunteers to be on his committee. Names were shared. **ACTION ITEM:** Don will ask three members to conduct an internal audit of our books.

WELCA: WELCA is planning the February birthday luncheon at the end of the month. Quilts have been donated to Friendship House and the Family Center. We are asking for gently used blankets for donation to Family Promise. There is a donation box at the back of the church.

Worship: Nothing new to add in addition to Dave's report.

President's Report: Council has been asked to provide soup for the Lenten soup supper on March 15th. A sign-up sheet was sent around.

Pastor's Report: The Synod has opened their Grace Grants applications. There is \$100,000 available for applicants. Deadline to apply is May 1. Potential ideas include Christmas Dinner, Youth programs, Youth mission trip, etc. Pastor attended the Lutherwood Annual meeting. Josephine Home would like to reach out to the local congregations to share information. We have two "chaplains" from our congregation that are serving at Josephine. Our book study will begin at next month's council meeting. **ACTION ITEM:** Council members are asked to read the introduction and Chapter 1 prior to next month's meeting.

Old Business:

- Anita reported on open items still needing action.
- **Photo Directory Status:** The directory is complete! They will be available beginning this Sunday for a \$10 suggested donation.
- **2023 Slate of Candidates:** Names were discussed to complete the slate of candidates for the annual meeting election.

- **UFO meal:** A family dinner is planned for Sunday evening, March 19th as a Fellowship event. Lane is planning this and will make an announcement in church. Church will provide salad, rolls, and drinks. Table hosts would provide a main dish.

Our next council meeting will be held March 9 at 6:30 pm.

The 10-year-old girl at the school we were visiting was asked, “When was the last time you went to the beach?” She paused, thought, and finally said rather quietly, “I think when I was three.”

This might not seem like a huge deal. Many people choose to not visit bodies of water. But you see, this little girl is a Lutheran Palestinian attending one of our Lutheran School in the West Bank. She is fluent in English. She is warm and engaging. She has dreams and aspirations. Her family is dedicated to her education, and they are faithful Christians. And she cannot get to the water that historically was her people’s land because of checkpoints and government policies. She is literally a few miles from the water that she cannot swim in.

In January, seventeen ELCA Bishops traveled to the Holy Land on a “Living Stones” listening tour. Bishop Azur of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL) invited us to come and see the Lutheran Church in the Holy Land and for us to witness firsthand how the Lutheran Church is positively impacting thousands of people.

On this tour we didn’t have time to visit many “holy sites.” Instead, this was a working trip that was designed to meet with those who are living in the Holy Land today – or as Palestinians say – to meet with the Living Stones of the Holy Land. During our time with our siblings in Christ, we learned and listened; prayed and contemplated; laughed and wept. These beautiful and courageous people welcomed us into their lives with grace and dignity. We were given an abundance of food, gifts, laughter, worship, and dancing.

And the stories. The stories were rich and beautiful ... and devastating. Like so many people throughout history whose lives have been ripped apart by oppressive powers, the Palestinian Christians have had their land, their identity, and their freedoms radically diminished. In some cases, completely erased.

Excerpts of stories I heard:

- The men whose family homes have been demolished because they cannot produce paperwork from the Ottoman Empire that their family has owned their land for over a century.
- The fourteen-year-old boy who was killed in a refugee camp. In his pocket was a piece of paper where he had written his last will and testament. Many young people are now carrying wills in their pockets as they fear they will be killed. • Concern that the Holy Land will become a museum rather than a living expression of the rich diversity of people who call this land their home.
- A principal at one of the Lutheran schools stating proudly: “We are educating the next creative leaders in Palestine and in the Middle East.”

Truly a highlight of this trip was the ordination of Pastor Sally Azur. Pastor Sally is the first Palestinian woman pastor in the Holy Land. She is called to serve two Lutheran Churches in the Holy Land and we are excited to see her flourish.


We were able to visit with a Jewish human rights organization, the United States Ambassador for Palestinian Affairs, the Palestinian Authority Prime Minister, the General Secretary of the Lutheran World Federation, and many others who listened to our concerns and who also stated their deep dedication to working for peace and justice in this land.

I confess that what I have written here barely touches on the complexity of the situation in the Holy Land. Hundreds if not thousands of books have been written. I am no expert. But as I continue to reflect on this trip – and as I hope to plan a trip for this synod in the next year or so – I hold this verse in my heart from Isaiah, “Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow.” Isaiah 1:17

May we all learn, seek, rescue, defend and plead for all of God’s beloved children. For the little girl who longs to see water. For the little boy whose life was cut short. For the men who want their family homes. For those who daily work for justice. For those who daily pray for peace. Oh God, we pray, Kyrie eleison.
