

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SCOTT

Anacortes Lutheran Church - October 2023 Newsletter

Members and Friends of Anacortes Lutheran Church,

I was speaking with someone the other day about what a Lutheran is. They were a person that did not grow up in a church environment and so were wondering what all the differences were that made so many different churches. I told them that to go through all the differences would take a couple of weeks to run through, but then I told them that all of them were Christian churches. They were confused about this because why would there be so many if they were all Christian churches. I gave the illustration that churches, like ice cream, has a lot of flavors (around 40,000 registered denominations in the US today), but that they all had the simple ingredients that made them a Christian church. "So it is all about the different flavors," they asked. Yes, it is about how we are flavored differently to reach the widest range of people with the message of God's love.

When I returned home later that day, I thought of this quote of Martin Luther:

The first thing I ask is that people should not make use of my name, and should not call themselves Lutherans but Christians. What is Luther? The teaching is not mine. Nor was I crucified for anyone...How did I, poor stinking bag of maggots that I am, come to the point where people call the children of Christ by my evil name?

It seems we do get caught up by those many things that differentiate us from one another and forget about all those things that we hold in common. Earlier today, a few of the other religious leaders in Anacortes gathered for a time of shared discussion and prayer and our conversation again returned to this idea of denominational differences not being nearly as important as how we see ourselves (and our churches) as gathered by Jesus and to share His story. It is Jesus who gathers us together and calls us friends.

When I start to dwell on how much of society seeks to create division, I remember that we are called by Jesus to live for God and for our neighbor. We are called to love our 'enemy' and not just those who think like we do. We are to live lives of reaching out to the "least of these" and to help however we can. We are to live out our Christian faith by being Christlike.

Yes, there will still be differences in thought and opinions. We may not agree as to the best way to go about providing the basics of life to everyone. We will not agree on which car to drive or what boat to float, but we can agree that God loves us and that we are called to love one another. If we can do this, it will be Kenough! (If you haven't watched the Barbie Movie, I recommend that you do if you are able!)

Council Minutes for September 14, 2023

Attendees: Pastor Scott, Anita Holzemer, Lane Phelan, Don Devine, Anne Barry, Dave White, Kathy Khile, Jeaneen Brogan, Jeanette Christensen, Heather Harrington, and Pat Carrie Smith

The meeting was called to order and opened with prayer. August minutes were approved as submitted. **Treasurer's Report**: Lane and Don met with our bookkeeper about updating our report format. More training is needed to create and adapt the forms with the new system. Giving continues to be steady. After payment of closure fees, we will receive the deed for the preschool building. Benevolences will be paid next month. There will be a potluck/information night to hear an updated report on MAF (Mission Aviation Fellowship) at the end of September. MSP to give \$500 in benevolences to MAF to help their mission.

Council Roundtable:

Education: Pancake breakfast will be held Oct I. Sunday School will begin on Oct 8. Going forward there will be an intergenerational activity on the first Sunday of each month instead of traditional Sunday School. New curriculum has been received and people are excited. Two additional preschool Sunday School teachers are needed.

Fellowship: Life is busy and volunteer slots are getting filled slowly but surely. New volunteer lists have helped. Advent dinners are coming.

Outreach: The committee met last week. We planned the Volunteer Fair on very short notice, but it was well received. A number of new volunteers stepped up. Christmas Dinner planning begins in October. We hope to return to on-site Christmas meals. Meals to go will continue as well. Outreach hopes to reinstitute the All Saint's Day dinner in November.

Preschool: Preschool is full. It started yesterday. Thank you to Don and crew for setting up the new play structures. They are up and being used. The preschool committee will be meeting soon and will discuss state licensure requirements.

Personnel: Jeaneen requested that we stock NARCAN® onsite for emergency usage. There may be a no to low cost options available to nonprofits for this. Pat Carrie Smith and Jeaneen have been meeting to discuss the LiveStream procedures and personnel. Becky is now doing the newsletter freeing up Rachel in the office for other duties. Two new employees have been hired to help in the nursery. Going forward we will offer nursery care during the education hour as well as the worship hour. Names of staff members were distributed and council members were asked to pray for them.

Property: First Saturday of the month was Property Day. Three people showed up. Better advertising is needed. The chair lift has been replaced and is completely operational. New woodchips were installed for the new play structures. A thank you will go into the newsletter to thank the volunteers. Don is doing research on getting a price to repave the main parking lot. Do we need a fundraiser to cover the costs? Multiple bids will need to be gotten. If we move forward, this would be a spring project.

Stewardship: Don will gather the stewardship committee to plan a stewardship kick-off for November.

WELCA: No board meeting was held, but Oct 8th was tentatively chosen as Quilt Blessing Sunday. Shipping is scheduled for November 5th. Bob Higgins has volunteered to drive the truck. The WELCA luncheon/picnic was well attended. Jeanette Christensen is stepping down as kitchen cleaner. She will do one last deep clean before she leaves this duty. Thank you to Jeanette for doing this chore for so long.

Worship: No report was submitted due to the chairman's absence.

Youth: Youth payment policies and procedures need to be reviewed with our new staff.

Pastor's Report: Report was submitted. We discussed the LIVE Project. This organization offers retreats and classes both on-site and virtually. They offer a bundle pricing for churches. For \$500 a year, anyone in the congregation can take any of the courses offered throughout the year. Information regarding this program and classes will be shared with the congregation at a Fellowship hour to gauge interest before committing the funds. Oyster Run breakfast will not be held this year. We will look at having it next year with more advance notice after encouraging participation from other city churches. Security procedures for the church need to be examined. Don will talk to Wayne Olsen about running power for outside security lights and cameras.

Old Business:

We are still recruiting for council members. Vacancies are for President, President-elect, Secretary, Worship, Youth, and Properties.

New Business:

The Legacy Endowment committee met. The decision was made to provide monetary support to purchase an AED, funds for Maui relief, the Christmas Dinner, and for local support to Anacortes Christian Church who coordinates community help.

A mobility contract was presented for the chairlift. MSP to purchase a 5-year maintenance contract.

We are beginning the conversation to update our church constitution. Lane will contact the synod for guidance.

Our next regular council meeting will be held October 12 at 6:30 pm. Please have committee reports in to Anita no later than noon on October 11th.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

FROM BISHOP SHELLEY BRYAN WEE -The Spirit October 2023

"Sometimes it's boring. Sometimes it's thrilling. Sometimes it makes me cry."

(Quote from "The Wonderful Ordinariness of Congregational Life" by Cheryl Fullerton, Christian Century, March 2022)

Recently I was thinking about church. (Full disclosure ... I think about church quite a bit.) But, in particular, I was thinking about the rhythm of church life. And I think the above quote from Cheryl Fullerton sums it up pretty nicely.

Sometimes it's boring.

I admit, sometimes there is something that is uninteresting about church. Perhaps it is the repetitive nature of it. Perhaps it is the cyclical nature of things. Perhaps it is seeing the same people in the same pew week after week and year after year.

We know that Fred will sing the hymns out of tune ... every time. We know that Mary will cluck her tongue at someone's tattoo peeking out from their sundress. We know that Mike will fall asleep during the sermon and we know that Dan will try to share the peace with every single person. We know that the children will fidget. We know that the baby might cry. We know that we have rituals and sacraments and prayers that we say each week. We know that sometimes we won't hear the utter preposterousness and absurdity and utterly amazing news that Jesus loves each of us and all of us – that sometimes this message sails over our heads because we're too busy looking at the bulletin.

And yet ...

Sometimes it's thrilling.

I always get goosebumps when I hear the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." I rejoice each Easter when we all shout, "He is risen! He is risen indeed!" Candles lit in darkness bring hope and light on Christmas Eve. When I am privileged to place bread in people's hands and I see young, old, wrinkled, black, white, brown hands reaching out for Jesus, it is truly miraculous.

We know that Fred cares for his wife with Alzheimer's. We know that Mary still grieves her daughter. We know that Mike works the late shift and we know that Dan only leaves his group home for church. We know that the children will hear of Jesus. We know that the baby will grow up in the community of elders. We know that sometimes we will hear and understand, if even for a moment, the utter preposterousness and absurdity and utterly amazing news that Jesus loves each of us and all of us.

And so ...

Sometimes it makes me cry.

Church is not for the faint-hearted. Church is not for people who only want to be with their own kind. Church is for the young, the middle-aged and the old. The healthy and the sick. The spiritually depleted and the spiritually full. Those who are seeking, those who are exhausted, and those who are filled with fire for justice. We all come together. The Freds and Marys and Mikes and Dans. And we sing and we pray and we receive Jesus, in community, together.

Church is wonderfully boring and thrilling. We catch glimpses of the divine amongst the coffee pot and petty disagreements. We see Mary hug the tattooed young girl after she is baptized. We see Mike exchange high fives with Dan. We see Fred with tears singing at the top of his lungs, "I Know that My Redeemer Lives."

There is nothing like church.
